The Warm Safe Home Project

In many cultures the home is key to our sense of safety. Our homes shelter us from the outside world and provide a space in which to carry out our lives and interact with our loved ones.

In elder abuse situations however, the home can become a place of danger.

The Warm Safe Home Project uses art-making to start conversations about elder abuse and to spread the message that everyone has the right to live free from violence and fear.
