Alanah Andrews is an Australian author and manager of an independent publishing imprint for speculative fiction. She has won several awards including the Birdcatcher Books Short Story Award and the Avid Readers Flash Fiction Prize. Alanah has published a post-apocalyptic novella *Exiles*, and currently has two books in her YA dystopian Eridu series.

Megan Blandford is an author and prolific freelance writer. As a well-respected voice on mental health and parenting, Megan writes for Sunday Life, Essential Baby, Kidspot, SBS, Whimn, Daily Life, Body+Soul and Headspace. Megan lives in country Victoria with her husband, two children and far too many animals. She is, currently, actually fine.



Mark Brandi's bestselling novel, Wimmera, won the British Crime Writers' Association Debut Dagger, and was named Best Debut at the Australian Indie Book Awards. It was shortlisted for the Australian Book Industry Awards Literary Fiction Book of the Year, and the Matt Richell Award for New Writer of the Year. His second novel, The Rip, is out now.

Sofie Dieu was born in France. Sensitive to cultural cliches, she has developed from it a penchant for the non-obvious and what makes us unique. Sofie's work was recently included in Hornsby Art Prize, Sydney North Art Prize and Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize. She took part in the Great Alpine Artist in Residence program in Victoria. As a result, she showcased her project Calling for Rain at the East Gippsland Art Gallery.

Kelly Gardiner's latest novel is *Brimstone*. Her previous book, 1917: Australia's Great War, was shortlisted for the NSW Premier's Young People's History Prize. Kelly's other books include the young adult novels Act of Faith and The Sultan's Eyes; the Swashbuckler pirate trilogy; and Goddess, based on the life of swordswoman and singer Mademoiselle de Maupin. Kelly teaches writing at LaTrobe University and is working on a novel about two female bushrangers.
