Disaster declared in Latrobe City Council area

Latrobe City Council registered for disaster recovery funding in response to Australian Government Registered Disaster Event No 1029 'South East Victorian storms: commencing 13 August 2022'.

Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements has committed up to \$1.8 million in further funding to help with disaster recovery for Council's local roads.

Schedule for completion

All work remains scheduled for completion during the 2022-2023 financial year – including damage due to the August 2022 storms. Future disaster recovery works are scheduled for Hallams Road, Jeeralang

North Road, Jeeralang West Road, Jumbuk Road Lindners Road, Morwell River Road, Old Jumbuk Road, Quarry Road, Shellcotts Road, and Taylors Road.

Work recently completed

Latrobe City Council is pleased to see remediation works complete at 27 of the registered sites it is monitoring. Many of the landslips are throughout the Strzelecki Ranges with two outliers in Yallourn North.

Roads where work has recently been completed include Budgeree Road, Grand Ridge Road, Morwell River East Branch Road, Prosper Valley Road, Summerfield Track, Traralgon Creek Road, Upper Middle Creek Road, Whitelaw's Track. Note that roadwork is in progress at other sites on several of these roads.
