# ENDORSEMENT OF PUBLIC ROAD NAMING REGISTER

#### 7.1 ENDORSEMENT OF PUBLIC ROAD NAMING REGISTER

#### 1. Purpose

To seek the Committee's approval of a list of eligible road naming submissions within Latrobe City (**Attachment 1**), and provide a list of ineligible names for noting (**Attachment 2**). If approved, the list will be published on Council's website, establishing a public register containing pre-approved road names.

For the Committee's noting, this report also contains submissions for names that have been assessed as ineligible against the Naming rules for places in Victoria (Naming Rules) set by Geographic Names Victoria (GNV) (**Attachment 3**).

#### 2. Executive Summary

- In March 2024 Council launched public consultation seeking submissions to a registry of place names. This resulted in 192 entries which have been assessed against the against the Naming Rules. Of these:
  - 87 submissions were deemed eligible for future road naming;
  - 45 submissions were deemed ineligible for future road naming; and
  - 39 submissions required further information. Submitters have been contacted with a request to provide additional information to support their submissions. Once the further information is provided, these will be assessed against the Naming Rules and if eligible, will be presented at a future Committee meeting.
  - 15 Indigenous names have been received. Consultation with GLaWAC is currently underway to confirm permission for their use and publication.
- Names were deemed ineligible if they were considered to not comply with the Naming Rules. Submissions will be deemed ineligible if they include:
  - duplication of existing names;
  - inappropriate or discriminatory language;
  - use of commercial names, overly long/complex names; or
  - names that could cause confusion for emergency services.
- A proposed public register of eligible names has been developed (**Attachment 1**) for the Committee to consider approving and provides benefit by:
  - creating an easily accessible list of eligible names vetted against the GNV
     Naming Rules and approved by the Committee; and
  - o enhancing transparency and community awareness of the naming process.


- Although not inscribed in the Naming Rules or Council's Policy, previous
   Councillor groups expressed a preference for names of military significance. As
   such, the names of military significance appear first on the list of eligible names at
   Attachment 1.
- Geographic Names Victoria gives preference to women's names to address their historic under-representation in road and place naming and to promote a more inclusive recognition of community contributions.
- The register has been arranged to reflect these preferences, while remaining consistent with Geographic Names Victoria (GNV) rules and Council policy.
- The register will be maintained by Council officers, updated periodically, and published on Council's website.
- Eligible names will remain on the register until selected for use in a formal road naming proposal, at which point they will be subject to GNV's final review and approval process before being officially adopted.
- Council continues to receive road naming submissions from community members, developers, and historical groups, which will be assessed against the Naming Principles, on a case by case basis.

#### 4. Background

The Naming Rules set by GNV are the statutory requirements for naming roads, features and localities, and establishes that road names must be unique, clear, culturally appropriate, and reflective of local history or geography. Council's Road, Facility and Place Name Policy, is aligned to the Naming Rules and also emphasises transparency and community engagement in naming processes.

Council, as a naming authority, plays a key role in ensuring that the use of names for roads, facilities, features and localities within the municipality are consistent with community expectations and adhere to the Naming Rules set by GNV.

Municipality road naming has previously been the responsibility of Council's Regional City Planning and Assets division. Council approved the formation of this Committee at its meeting on 28 July 2025 to determine and approve new road names or alterations of existing road names.

#### 5. Analysis

In March 2024 Council launched a public consultation seeking submissions to a register of place naming resulting in 192 entries which have been assessed against the Naming Rules. Of these, 97 were deemed eligible for future road naming, 56 submissions were deemed ineligible, and 39 required further information.

Establishing a pre-approved register formalises a pool of vetted names, to assist and inform the community and provide developers with certainty at the planning stage. Council will maintain the naming register for use in the naming of roads, parks, open spaces and buildings owned or managed by Council with this register being publicly available on Council's website.

Submissions of names for consideration to be added to the register can be made at any time using the online form.


#### 6. Consultation/Communication

The community is able to submit proposed names in two ways:

- 1. Via the ongoing Have Your Say campaign on Council's website; or
- 2. Via written submission from property developers and historical groups.

New submissions will be presented to the Committee for endorsement at each meeting.

The approved road naming register will be published on Council's website and updated regularly.



#### 7.2 PROPOSED ROAD NAMING - AIRVAN WAY, MORWELL

#### 1. Purpose

To provide information and seek approval of the naming and registration of a roadway off Airfield Road in Morwell.

#### 2. Executive Summary

- The unnamed road runs west off Airfield Road Morwell, adjacent to the Latrobe Regional Airport.
- Australia Post and other deliveries are impacted by the unnamed road.
- There is potential hazard for emergency services to locate persons or business premises on the road.
- The Latrobe Regional Airport Asset Committee proposed the road be named Airvan Way.
- Geographic Names Victoria (GNV) have previously approved Airvan Way, Morwell as suitable.
- Officers are proposing this road be named Airvan Way.
- The Committee's approval of the proposed road name is required before community consultation can begin.
- The naming process for roads is set out in the *Naming Rules for Places in Victoria 2022* (the "Naming Rules") and the road now needs to be named in a manner consistent with the Naming Rules (**Attachment 1**).

#### 3. Recommendation

- 1. approves Airvan Way, Morwell as the proposed name for this road; and
- 2. notes that this name will be progressed to the community consultation stage.

#### 4. Background




Figure 1: Subject road (Source ArcGIS dated December 2024)

The road in question is not officially named. Refer to Figure 1 for ariel of location.

There are multiple businesses trading on the road.

Emergency and delivery services to these businesses may be significantly affected due to an inability to easily locate residences via GPS services.

The proposed name "Airvan" was submitted by the Latrobe Regional Airport Advisory Committee and complies with Council's naming principles and the Naming Rules.

#### 1. Purpose

To provide information and seek approval of the naming and registration of a longstanding unnamed road in Newborough.

#### 2. Executive Summary

- The road in question is not officially named. It is known to the residents by a variety of names including Princes Freeway, Lot 1 John Field Drive, Lot 7 John Field Drive, Lot 6 John Field Drive, Lot 1 Hagans Track, Tourist Drive 94.
- The road has two households residing on it.
- Confusion arises during the provision of emergency services to the residents by the road being unnamed.
- The naming process for roads is set out in the Naming Rules for Places in Victoria (Naming Rules) (Attachment 1) set by Geographic Names Victoria (GNV). Therefore, the road must be named in a manner consistent with the Naming Rules.
- Officers are proposing this road be named 'Roadhouse Close Newborough'. This name is consistent the Naming Rules. The proposed name was submitted by a resident.
- The Committee's approval of the proposed road name in Newborough is required before community consultation can begin.

#### 3. Recommendation

- 1. approves Roadhouse Close, Newborough as the proposed name for this road; and
- 2. notes that this name will be progressed to the community consultation stage.

#### 4. Background

The road in question is not officially named and is known to the residents by a variety of names including Princes Freeway, Lot 1 John Field Drive, Lot 7 John Field Drive, Lot 6 John Field Drive, Lot 1 Hagans Track, Tourist Drive 94. Refer to Figure 1 for aerial view.

There are two separate households residing on the road.

Residents from each household have required emergency services for medical events. Services to these residents have been significantly delayed due to an inability to easily locate residences via GPS services.

The proposed name Roadhouse Close was submitted by a resident on this road and complies with the Naming Rules.

#### 7.4 APPROVAL OF NAMING FOR MULTIPLE SUBDIVISIONS

#### 1. Purpose

To seek the Committee's approval for new road names associated with five (5) recent subdivisions in Morwell and Newborough.

#### 2. Executive Summary

Subdivision One – Toners Lane, Morwell

- Subdivision one at Toners Lane, Morwell (**Attachment 1**) requires the naming of a new road. The precise road location within the subdivision is yet to be determined.
- For subdivision one, the developer has proposed a golf-themed naming suite, consistent with the historic use of the land as a golf driving range.
- The proposed name of the new road is Eagle Place, Morwell.

#### Subdivision Two – Wedge Street, Morwell


- Subdivision two at Wedge Street, Morwell (**Attachment 2**) requires the naming of a new road. The precise road location within the subdivision is yet to be determined.
- For subdivision two, the developer has proposed a golf-themed naming suite, consistent with the historic use of the land as a golf driving range.
- The proposed name of the new road is Birdie Place, Morwell.
- The developer has also requested "Bunker" be approved for future use.

#### Subdivision Three – John Field Drive, Newborough.

- Subdivision three at John Field Drive, Newborough (**Attachment 3**) requires two new road names.
- For subdivision three the developer has proposed a British-themed naming suite tied to European settlement and agricultural development.
- Proposed names for subdivision three in Newborough are:
  - a. Ashford Road, Newborough.
  - b. Willowbrook Court, Newborough.

#### Subdivision Four - Tramway Road, Morwell.

- Subdivision four at the roundabout of Tramway Road and Kirwin Road, Morwell (**Attachment 4**) requires the naming of a new road.
- The proponent has suggested a name based on native flora in the vicinity.
- The proposed name for subdivision four in Morwell is Black Wattle Circuit.





#### Subdivision Five – Waterloo Grazing Estate, Moe


- Subdivision five at Arapiles and Nelson Way, Moe (**Attachment 5**) requires the naming of a new road.
- The proponent has suggested this road is named after Michel Ney who was a commander in the battle of Waterloo which is the naming theme for the estate.
- The proposed name for subdivision five in Moe is Ney Walk.
- The naming process for roads is outlined in the Naming Rules for Places in Victoria (Naming Rules) (**Attachment 6**) set by Geographic Names Victoria (GNV), and roads must be named in a manner consistent with the Naming Rules.
- All submissions have been assessed against the Naming Rules and found suitable

#### 3. Recommendation

#### Recommendation

That the Committee approves the following proposed names:

- 1. Eagle Place Morwell for use in Subdivision One;
- 2. Birdie Place Morwell for use in Subdivision Two;
- 3. Bunker for future use in Subdivisions One and Two;
- 4. Ashford Road and Willowbrook Court Newborough for use in Subdivision Three;
- 5. Black Wattle Circuit Morwell for use in Subdivision Four; and
- 6. Ney Walk Moe for use in Subdivision Five.



#### APPROVAL OF NAMING FOR MULTIPLE SUBDIVISIONS

#### 4. Background

Multiple subdivisions are underway across Morwell and Newborough with developers and other proponents submitting suggested names for road naming within these subdivisions.

All submissions have been assessed against the Naming Rules and found suitable.

For subdivisions one and two, the developer has proposed a golf-themed naming suite, consistent with the historic use of the land as a golf driving range. The proposed names are Eagle Place, Morwell and Birdie Place, Morwell, with Bunker (road type not yet determined) proposed for approved future use.

For subdivision three the developer has proposed British-themed naming suite tied to European settlement and agricultural development. The proposed road names are Ashford Road, Newborough and Willowbrook Court, Newborough.

For subdivision four the proposed name 'Black Wattle Circuit' is based on the presence of Acacia mearnsii (Black Wattle) vegetation observed along Waterhole Creek, which borders the western boundary of the Gippsland Logistics and Manufacturing Precinct (GLaMP) site. This native species is listed in Council's *Indigenous Plants of Latrobe City* publication and was identified during the 2023 Flora and Fauna Assessment undertaken for the precinct.

For subdivision five the proposed name of Ney Walk, Moe recognises Marshall Michel Ney, a commander at the Battle of Waterloo, in accordance with the estate's Waterloo-themed naming convention.

#### 5. Analysis

All proposed names have been assessed against the Naming Rules and determined by officers to be eligible for naming.

Initial name checks have been conducted against VICNAMES and are available.

#### 6. Consultation/Communication

Under the Naming Rules, community consultation is not required for subdivision naming, as the proposed names are thematic.
