COMMUNITY CONSULTATION UPDATE - MOE GARDENS CARAVAN PARK

PURPOSE

To present the submissions received from the engagement process seeking community input into the future of the Moe Gardens Caravan Park located at 1 Mitchells Road, Moe.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The Moe Gardens Caravan Park is situated at 1 Mitchells Road, Moe, the site is Crown land with Council the appointed Committee of Management. The operations of the caravan park are delivered by third party operator, who has a lease agreement with Council.
- In advance of the current lease with the park operator ending in May 2026,
 Council commenced community engagement to inform decision making about the future of the site.
- Community engagement included a Have Your Say campaign via our website from 18 September until 31 October 2025, this digital campaign was supported with strong communications and engagement from Officers with site holders at the caravan park.
- Council received a large number of submissions through the campaign and these are presented for information, 223 Submissions were received up until 5pm Friday 31 October **Attachment 1.**
- Several submissions included commercially sensitive information, these have been included as Confidential Attachment 2.
- The majority of submissions were in support of retaining the caravan park to provide low cost accommodation options or attract short stay tourism.
- A further report will be presented to Council at the February 2026 Meeting detailing the options available to continue to operate a caravan park from the site.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

 receives and notes the public submissions providing input into the future of Moe Gardens Caravan Park, 1 Mitchells Road, Moe and thanks the community for their feedback; and

2.	requests a report be presented at the February 2026 Council Meeting detailing the options available to continue to operate a caravan park at 1 Mitchells Road, Moe.

BACKGROUND

The caravan park is situated on 3.2 hectares and used to be located on the outskirts of Moe township, but as housing development has grown in Moe to keep up with the pace of population growth, the park is now located within the heart of Moe Township. The use of the caravan park has evolved significantly since the start of the lease (2008), with a reduction in short term caravaning and holiday camping.

In advance of the current lease ending in May 2026 (there is no provision in the lease to extend the current lease term), Council commenced Community Engagement to understand from the community their vision for the site to inform decision making about the future of the site at 1 Mitchells Road, Moe.

Future uses for the site will also be guided by the Planning Zone (PPRZ) and the Victorian Government's Leasing Policy for Victorian Crown Land 2023.

Council undertook extensive community engagement from 18 September until 31 October 2025, via Council's *Have Your Say* platform. The campaign was supported with direct communication with the site holders, correspondence to adjacent users of the wider Joe Tabuteau reserve, and property owners and social media and website presence.

Council received 223 submissions on the future of the site, and these are presented for Council's consideration. **Attachment 1** and **Confidential Attachment 2**.

ANALYSIS

Following the extensive community engagement process, Council received 223 submissions (**Attachment 1** and **Confidential Attachment 2**) via the Have Your Say platform with the summary of results tabled below:

Returned to Public Open Space	(27 Submissions) 12%
Alternative Use under the PPRZ	(18 Submissions) 8%

Themes on the submissions

The major themes from the submissions overall were:

- Retain the existing caravan park as a site for long term residents to reside.
- Retain the existing caravan park with improvements to the existing facilities and visual presentation of the site including suggestions for additional infrastructure to attract families and additional stays, including public access to the dump point.

Many respondents highlighted the valued of the:

- Tourism benefits, especially for sporting events including basketball and inline hockey.
- Lack of alternative accommodation options, only 2 other accommodation providers in Moe.
- Central location to the Moe township.
- Historical value given the longer tenure in its current location.

Of the respondents wishing to see the park returned to public open space / gardens and alternative uses included:

- Closure of the caravan park.
- Adventure park / play space.
- BMX or Mountain Bike park.
- Relaxing park with a water feature.
- Creating an off leash dog park on the site.

Given the strong sentiment of the community to see the caravan park continue in some form, Officers will prepare a future report that explores the options available to see a caravan park continuing to be delivered from this site.

Options to consider include:

- Manage the caravan park via an independent third party operator in it's current condition.
- Manage the caravan park via an independent third party operator with additional infrastructure upgrades to increase short stay appeal.

Consideration of the requirements of the Victorian Government's *Best Practice Guidelines for Committees of Management, Managing Caravan Parks and Camping on Crown land* will be included in this future report.

MOE OUTDOOR POOL PETITION

PURPOSE

To provide information in response to the Petition requesting the Moe Outdoor Pool to be heated.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

 At the February 2025 Council Meeting a petition (Attachment 1), containing 151 signatures, was tabled and requested to be presented at an upcoming Council meeting. The petition outlined the following:

That the Moe Outdoor Pool be upgraded with heating facilities to remove the constraints on opening times due to weather. The community of Moe will then have an outdoor aquatic venue with a comfortable temperature throughout the year. This will extend the useability of the facility for the enthusiastic swimmers, young and old, who are keen on using the pool for fitness. It will also support the facilitation of activities such as school swimming events and competitive race meets throughout the year.

- Latrobe City currently has six leisure facilities, with four leisure centres that
 operate heated indoor pools, located in Moe/Newborough, Churchill, Morwell
 and Traralgon and two seasonal outdoor pools in Moe and Yallourn North. The
 Gippsland Regional Aquatic Centre (GRAC) in Traralgon also operates a
 heated 25-metre outdoor pool that is open all year-round.
- The Moe Outdoor Pool is an unheated, eight-lane, 50 metre outdoor pool that is
 used for lap swimming and recreational use. It currently operates from the end
 of November until the Labour Day long weekend in March each year, with
 opening dependent upon weather.
- During the 2024/25 summer season, the Moe Outdoor Pool had 7,907 visits for recreational use, down from 9,389 visits in the previous summer. School carnival attendance is part of this annual attendance with an average of 18 swimming carnivals held annually.
- Usage of the Moe Outdoor Pool is considered low, with the cost of visits subsidised at \$27.73 per recreational swim. This compares to \$3.65 per paid visit at Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough which has an indoor heated pool.
- The Moe Outdoor Pool, Yallourn North Outdoor Pool and Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough are located within a 12km distance of each other and Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough is situated 4km from Moe Outdoor Pool.
- A high level estimate of the capital cost to install heating at Moe Outdoor Pool is in the range of \$2m to \$3m.

- Should the Moe Outdoor Pool commence operating all year round as per the intention of the petition, the operating costs are estimated to increase by \$220,000 per year.
- Overall, the operation and maintenance of Council's Leisure facilities costs approximately \$4.5m annually.
- When benchmarking the provision of aquatic and leisure facilities in nearby Local Government Areas, Latrobe City has the highest number of facilities operating all year round.
- Council have requested that Officers increase financial sustainability throughout the organisation. The significant cost of heating the Moe Outdoor Pool does not align with this objective.
- Given the high estimated costs associated with heating the Moe Outdoor Pool, the current cost of delivering all Leisure facilities and the level of provision of leisure and aquatic facilities in Latrobe City, rather than initiating a capital works project in isolation of other facilities, Officers recommend reviewing all leisure facilities.
- Officers propose to seek funding through the 2026/27 budget development to undertake a comprehensive strategic assessment of all leisure and aquatic facilities to appropriately inform the future development, maintenance, and investment in leisure facilities.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- notes officers will refer for consideration in the 2026/27 budget development process, an allocation to undertake a comprehensive strategic assessment of all leisure and aquatic facilities, to appropriately inform the future development, maintenance, and investment in leisure facilities; and
- 2. notifies the head petitioner of the outcome of this report.

BACKGROUND

Latrobe City currently has six leisure facilities, with four leisure centres that operate heated indoor pools, located in Moe/Newborough, Churchill, Morwell and Traralgon and two seasonal outdoor pools in Moe and Yallourn North. The Gippsland Regional Aquatic Centre (GRAC) in Traralgon also operates a heated 25-metre outdoor pool that is open all year-round.

Moe Outdoor Pool

The Moe Outdoor Pool opened in 1957 and is located in Vale Street, Moe. It is operated during the warmer months from late November to early March each year. The operating hours are set by the previous day's 6pm forecast, and if the temperature is forecast at 25°C or above, opening hours are determined based on the maximum forecast. On average, it is open 57 days per season.

Moe Outdoor Pool facilities include an eight lane, 50 metre outdoor pool that is suitable for lap swimming and recreational use. There is also a separate diving pool with a diving board and a shallow water pool along with an interactive water play area and range of amenities including a kiosk, electric barbecues, change facilities including an all abilities change room to accommodate people with mobility requirements and grassed spaces and shade shelters.

In 2013 the pool structure had a complete rebuild that included the demolition of the pool concourse and plant room building, construction of a new toddler pool, all pipe work replaced, fit out of a new plant room building and commission of installed equipment. Between 2023 and 2025 the plant equipment had further significant upgrades completed.

Attendance at Moe Outdoor Pool is as follows:

Year	Paid Attendances
2022/2023	7,795
2023/2024	9,389
2024/2025	7,907

Swimming carnival attendance is the most significant attendance for the site, with an average of 18 swimming carnivals held each year. The pool is not used for swimming lessons as these need to be consistently programmed. They are therefore held at Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough in the indoor pool, which is a suitable facility.

Over the past two years, the Moe Swimming Club (MSC) have requested Council to consider heating the MOP on several occasions. The MSC has 81 members, which includes 49 swimming members. Discussions with the swimming club have indicated that they would like the Moe Outdoor Pool to be heated to increase utilisation and participation by the club.

During 2023 and 2024, officers have supported the MSC to increase lane requirements to support their requests. Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough has a significant amount of additional lane capacity on weekdays and weekends, should the MSC need to increase usage, however, the club have not requested any additional lanes and officer observations indicate that additional lanes are not required.

At the February 2025 Council meeting, Council was presented with a petition, with 151 signatures, with the following details:

Moe Outdoor Pool is a beautiful venue where our local community can enjoy recreational swimming, training for competition or swim with friends and family. However, the lack of heating at the pool limits the community's usage to between 30 November and 10 March, and only on days when the temperature is above 25 degrees.

We, the undersigned request that the Moe Outdoor Pool be upgraded with heating facilities to remove the constraints on opening times due to weather. The community of Moe will then have an outdoor aquatic venue with a comfortable temperature throughout the year. This will extend the useability of the facility for the enthusiastic swimmers, young and old, who are keen on using the pool for fitness. It will also support the facilitation of activities such as school swimming events and competitive race meets throughout the year.

ANALYSIS

A high level estimate to heat an outdoor pool through electrification is likely to be in the range of \$2m to \$3m to complete. The reason for the variance in the cost include the following considerations, which require further scoping:

- The need for electrical service upgrades required.
- The level of alterations required for integration into the existing plant room.
- Any additional costs such as trenching and structural adjustments to the plant.

The options for heating an outdoor pool also include:

- Geothermal;
- Solar;
- Heat Pumps; and
- Gas.

Subsequent annual operating and maintenance costs would require a further analysis and cost estimate, however, should the pool season be extended, as per the intention of the petition, the annual operating costs are estimated to increase by more than \$220,000. This increase does not account for additional maintenance costs which would also increase.

Council Subsidy

Overall, the cost to operate and maintain Latrobe City's Leisure facilities is approximately \$4.5 million annually.

The actual financial outlay for Moe Outdoor Pool for 2024/2025 was \$219,256 and this comprised of \$184,144 for operations, and \$35,112 for maintenance.

The operational budget for 2025/2026 is \$175,535, and includes:

- Facility operational costs, including wages, utilities and resources \$162,835.
- Maintenance and asset related costs \$12,700.

The Council subsidy per visit for 2024/2025 at the Moe Outdoor Pool was the highest of all Latrobe City income generating leisure facilities and was subsidised at \$27.73 per visit, compared to \$3.65 at Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough. The Yallourn North Outdoor Pool subsidy is higher at \$62.50 per visit, however entry is free.

The Moe Outdoor Pool, Yallourn North Outdoor Pool and Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough are located within a 12km distance from each other and Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough is situated 4km from Moe Outdoor Pool.

Latrobe Leisure Facility Network

The Moe Outdoor Pool is part of a network of leisure and aquatic facilities in Latrobe City, where there are four indoor aquatic facilities open year round and two outdoor aquatic facilities located within the municipality. Comparative data from surrounding local government area aquatic facility provision indicates that Latrobe City has the highest number of facilities opened all year round, the lowest population number per indoor facility and the smallest land area per facility. This indicates a relatively high level of community access to leisure facilities.

Considering the high initial capital costs and on-going operational expense of heating the Moe Outdoor Pool, along with low demand of the pool, and the objective of operating in a more financially sustainable environment, there appears to be no justification for outlaying the cost of heating the pool. However, there is also currently no overall strategic plan for Latrobe City's leisure and aquatic facilities.

A Leisure and Aquatic Strategy can provide a long-term planning framework to assess, prioritise, and guide the development, maintenance, and investment in leisure facilities to meet the current and future needs of the community. A strategy would assist to make informed decisions about where to invest, how to modernise ageing facilities, and how to ensure everyone has access to safe and enjoyable leisure environments. Such a strategy would be underpinned by industry expertise and, importantly, enable community engagement.

Therefore, Officers propose the development of a Leisure and Aquatic Strategy to appropriately inform the future investment requirements and direction of the Council's Leisure and Aquatics assets. Officers estimate the cost of developing a strategy to be approximately \$100,000.

CONSULTATION

Consultation for this report has occurred with the Latrobe Leisure and City Assets teams and direct engagement with the Moe Swimming Club.

COMMUNICATION

If the decision is made not to proceed with the heating of the Moe Outdoor Pool, this outcome will be communicated to the head petitioner and the Moe Swimming Club.

APPENDIX 1 IMPACT ASSESSMENT

Gender

A Gender Impact Assessment (GIA) under the *Gender Equality Act 2020* has not been conducted however will be completed should the project be progressed and funded.

Social

Aquatic facilities are recognised as integral community assets that promote social inclusion and provide a space for community to socialise. The potential heating of the Moe Outdoor Pool and opening all year round, may have a social benefit for the broader community and the members of the MSC.

Cultural

Heating the Moe Outdoor Pool could potentially provide greater access to cultures where community wellbeing is a priority, however, it is noted that there is an indoor heated pool in close proximity so this utilisation may be minimal.

Health

Heating the Moe Outdoor Pool, and opening all year round, may provide an additional space for community members to participate in recreational swimming and for swimming club members to access an outdoor facility for their training, noting that this is currently able to be accommodated at Latrobe Leisure Moe Newborough.

Environmental

Heating the Moe Outdoor Pool will have some impact on Council's carbon footprint, however this will be dependent on the energy source used. The environmental impact can be reduced with the use of solar heating, using a pool cover and regular maintenance.

Economic

Currently the report template does not explicitly call for economic analysis as distinct from financial analysis. This section has been added in recognition of council's role as provider of enabling infrastructure supporting private and public investment and our more limited role in the social safety net system.

Financial

The cost of operationg all leisure facilities annually is \$4.5 million. To add heating to the Moe Outdoor Pool is expected to add significant additional cost, estimated to include the following:

- \$2m to \$3m for capital works.
- At least \$220,000 additional annual operating and maintenance costs.

None of these estimated costs are currently captured within budgets. If there was an intention to explore heating the Moe Outdoor Pool, a consultant experienced in a conversion of this nature would need to be engaged to ensure the design is optimal for a pool of this age and condition, and the real costs accurately forecast.

A comprehensive asset integrity and compliance inspection would also be required to understand any works required to ensure the sustainability of the pool into the future

PROVISION OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES (RV) DUMP POINTS IN LATROBE CITY

PURPOSE

To provide Council with information in response to the community petition received in July 2025 regarding the establishment of 72-hour RV stops with free dump points in Moe, Morwell and Churchill.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Council received a community petition (Attachment 1) with 405 valid signatures requesting that Council establish 72-hour RV stays with free dump points in Moe, Morwell and Churchill to encourage travellers to stop and spend locally.
- Latrobe City currently has five dump points, of which only two are accessible to the public. There is 1 designated 48-hour free camping site and numerous longbay RV parking bays within the municipality.
- Regional benchmarking indicates that neighbouring councils favour low-cost, community-managed dump points and RV sites over high capital investment models.
- Capital costs for compliant dump points vary from \$50,000 to \$100,000 per site, with vehicle access and site works approximately \$50,000 \$500,000 depending on scale and surface. Operational and utilities costs are approximately \$10,000 per annum, depending on supervision and site conditions with additional costs of unscheduled maintenance/misuse allowance approximately \$10,000 per annum.
- Evidence of informal or unauthorised overnight camping is already occurring in several locations across Latrobe City, posing a risk of undermining the viability of private caravan park operators by effectively providing and encouraging free stays.
- In accordance with the Events & Visitor Economy Strategy 2024 2028, under Priority 3 – maximising economic and social outcomes from events and the visitor economy, officers will investigate initiatives to enhance Latrobe City's RV friendliness, assessing which options deliver genuine regional economic benefit and which provide community convenience only, ensuring future investment is evidence-based and strategic.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. notes the response to the community petition received in July 2025 regarding the provision of RV stops and dump points and;
- 2. notes that Officers will notify the head petitioner of Council's consideration of the community petition.

BACKGROUND

In July 2025, Council received a community petition with 405 signatures requesting that Council consider establishing designated 72-hour RV stays with free dump points in Moe, Morwell and Churchill.

The petition outlined the following objectives:

- 1. Establish 72-hour caravan/RV stays with free dump points in the three major towns to attract travellers and encourage local spending.
- 2. Engage with caravan and tourism groups to ensure facilities meet traveller needs and are well promoted.
- 3. List any new sites on national caravan travel applications (e.g. Wikicamps and CamperMate) to maximise awareness.
- 4. Recognise the broader economic benefits that RV travellers bring to local businesses and communities.

The petitioners highlighted that implementing these facilities would support small business growth, strengthen local tourism, and enhance Latrobe City's profile as an RV-friendly destination.

ANALYSIS

Strategic Context

The Events and Visitor Economy Strategy 2024 – 2028, adopted by Council in 2024, sets out a vision to strengthen the City's visitor economy through infrastructure and experience development. Under *Priority 3 – maximising economic and social outcomes from events and the visitor economy*, specific reference is made to improving Latrobe City's RV friendliness.

Definitions

To ensure clarity in terminology, the following definitions apply:

- RV Parking: Designated, oversized bays suitable for self-contained vehicles, typically located near retail or visitor precincts.
- Free Camping (48-hour): Council-endorsed short-stay areas allowing selfcontained vehicles to stay overnight without charge, typically excluding tents or uncontained vans.
- Dump Point: A facility designed for the safe discharge of blackwater and greywater waste from self-contained vehicles into sewer or approved holding systems.
- **Environmental Compliance:** All installations must comply with EPA Victoria's Code of Practice for Onsite Wastewater Management and Gippsland Water's discharge requirements.

Environmental and Site Considerations

When assessing the suitability of potential RV sites or dump points, the following environmental and infrastructure factors must be addressed:

- Connection or proximity to existing sewerage infrastructure.
- Level, all-weather vehicle access and adequate turnaround capacity.
- Provision of lighting, visibility and passive surveillance to ensure user safety.
- A minimum 50-metre setback from waterways or drainage lines.
- Integration with existing visitor amenities such as toilets, bins, and signage.

Current Provision (2025)

Latrobe City currently has five dump points, located as follows:

- Park Lane Caravan Park, Traralgon.
- Village Caravan Park, Traralgon.
- Tandara Caravan Park, Traralgon.
- Moe Gardens Caravan Park, Moe.
- Yinnar RV Stop, Yinnar.

Of these, only Moe Gardens Caravan Park and Yinnar facilities are accessible to the general public. Moe Gardens charges \$5 per use; and Yinnar's community-managed facility relies on an honesty box system.

Neighbouring Gippsland Councils:

- Baw Baw Shire: Two public access dump points (Rawson, Neerim South Recreation Reserve).
- Wellington Shire: Ten dump points (five Council-managed).
- South Gippsland Shire: Ten dump points, six free for public use, several community or business-managed.

Neighbouring municipalities have generally favoured community-led, low-cost models rather than large Council-funded installations.

Indicative Cost Considerations

While detailed costings would need to be site-specific, indicative costs for compliant dump point infrastructure are:

- Installation approximately \$50,000 \$100,000 per dump point.
- Vehicle access and site works approximately \$50,000 \$500,000 depending on scale and surface.
- Asset renewal approximately \$3,000 \$18,000 per annum.
- Operational and utilities costs approximately \$10,000 per annum.

- Staffing range \$0–\$71,000 per annum (Gippsland Water requires supervised access in some instances).
- Unscheduled maintenance/misuse allowance approximately \$10,000 per annum.

High maintenance and misuse costs have been cited by neighbouring councils as a contributing factor in discontinuing or relocating dump points.

Current Demand

Available information on demand for RV parking and dump points within Latrobe City is almost entirely anecdotal. While it is reasonable to expect that these facilities would be used if provided, there is no data or evidence demonstrating that such investment would generate a material increase in local spending or measurable growth in the visitor economy.

Feedback from industry stakeholders suggests that a significant portion of use would likely come from local residents returning from travel outside the region, rather than visiting tourists.

As such, the current evidence base does not support a clear economic case for investment, and further analysis is required before proceeding with new infrastructure.

Next Steps

As indicated in the Events and Visitor Economy Action Plan, under *Priority 3 – maximising economic and social outcomes from events and the visitor economy, the Plan* identifies the need to improve Latrobe City's RV friendliness.

To deliver on this action, officers will undertake a comprehensive investigation into a range of initiatives that could enhance the RV experience across the municipality.

This work will assess which options have the potential to deliver genuine economic benefits for the region and which would serve primarily as community convenience measures, ensuring that future investment is evidence-based and strategically aligned.

CONSULTATION

For the preparation of this current briefing, officers have undertaken targeted internal consultation with the Tourism and Major Events Advisory Committee, the Visitor Information Centre Network, Destination Gippsland, and relevant Council teams across planning, recreation, and engineering. This has ensured alignment with existing strategies, technical requirements, and regional tourism priorities.

As part of delivering the Priority 3 Action – maximising economic and social outcomes from events and the visitor economy, further consultation will be essential to inform future work aimed at improving Latrobe City's RV friendliness. This will include engagement with:

- Gippsland Water, to determine sewerage capacity, environmental standards, and compliance considerations.
- The Campervan & Motorhome Club of Australia (CMCA), to access national RV user data, visitor insights, and promotional opportunities.
- Local businesses, service stations, and caravan park operators, to refine demand data, identify viable partnership models, and mitigate potential conflicts.
- Community and progress associations, to gauge local interest and support for proposed sites.

This next phase of consultation will help validate actual demand, assess site feasibility, and ensure any future investment or partnership opportunities are evidence-based, sustainable, and aligned with the broader Events & Visitor Economy Strategy.

COMMUNICATION

Following the Council briefing, communication activities will focus on closing out the petition and informing the community of Council's position and next steps. This will include:

- Providing a public update summarising Council's response to the petition and outlining how the matter will be progressed through the Events & Visitor Economy Strategy.
- Direct correspondence with the lead petitioner to formally acknowledge the outcome of Council's consideration.
- Internal communications to ensure relevant Council teams and the Tourism and Major Events Advisory Committee are briefed on the decision and next steps.

If feasibility work proceeds under the Priority 3 Action – maximising economic and social outcomes from events and the visitor economy, communication will form part of a broader engagement plan. This will include:

- Community engagement through Council's formal consultation channels to inform and seek feedback on potential RV initiatives.
- Targeted discussions with key stakeholders, including tourism operators, local businesses, and RV associations, to support data collection and partnership development.

Clear communication of environmental, planning and compliance requirements to ensure community understanding of any future RV infrastructure proposals.

TRANSITION RESERVE POLICY

PURPOSE

To seek Council endorsement of the proposed Transition Reserve Policy.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The Latrobe City Council Transition Reserve (Reserve) was established in the 2024/25 Council Budget by resolution of Council.
- The Reserve was introduced to ensure monies were set aside to support the Latrobe City economy due to the pending closures of the coal fired power stations and the Victorian State Government driven changes to the timber industry.
- A Transition Reserve Policy (Policy) has been drafted to provide guidance for use of the funds in the Reserve. A copy of the draft Policy is at Attachment 1.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. endorses the Latrobe City Council Transition Reserve Policy;
- 2. allocates 50% of any future annual budget surplus to the Transition Reserve; and
- 3. consolidates the Yallourn Transition Reserve and any profits realised from the sale of land at the Gippsland Logistics and Manufacturing Precinct into the Transition Reserve.

BACKGROUND

Council has long identified the need to support the Latrobe City economy due to the structural changes to the traditional industry base in the region. As a result of this identified need, a Transition Reserve was established in the 2024/25 Council Budget by resolution of Council. The Reserve was introduced to ensure monies were set aside to support the Latrobe City economy in light of the pending closures of the coal fired power stations and the Victorian State Government driven changes to the timber industry.

The Reserve is evidence of Council's commitment to supporting the transition of the economy through increasing employment opportunities throughout the municipality

This Policy relates to the following Strategic Direction and Key Objective from the Council Plan 2025-2029:

Our Economy - Investment, Jobs, Growth

We are committed to working with our community and key stakeholders to grow our local economy to provide a wide range of job opportunities, economic diversification, and attract investment.

Key Objective 1 - Investment

Actively pursue investment in emerging industries and industries that diversify our local economy to create jobs and increase economic growth.

ANALYSIS

Given the size of the Reserve, which will likely increase annually, it is important to have a framework for use of these funds, to ensure that an allocation is in accordance with the intent set out in the adopted budget. This Policy provides guidance for the framework, including eligibility, delegations, accountabilities and responsibilities.

The Policy has been drafted with the goal of diversifying the Latrobe City economy and delivery of sustainable long term employment. This will be achieved through facilitating the development of enabling economic infrastructure delivered by Council.

The Reserve will provide for the investment in new economic development projects that Council will identify and deliver. It can be used to leverage Federal and State Government funds for projects or directly invest in appropriate projects to deliver optimal economic and community benefit and/or supporting sustainable local development.

The Reserve was introduced to ensure monies were set aside to support the Latrobe City economy due to the pending closures of the coal fired power stations and the Victorian State Government driven changes to the timber industry. 50% of any annual surplus is allocated to the Reserve in accordance with the Council resolution.

It is proposed, in order to grow the value of the Reserve, that the Yallourn Reserve Fund also be consolidated into the Transition Reserve. The Yallourn Fund was established to ensure monies were set aside to balance the reduction in rates revenue post the closure of Yallourn.

Council also resolved at the December 2023 Council meeting that any revenue generated from the sale of the lots from the GLaMP, that exceeds the total cost to complete the enabling infrastructure on the GLaMP, be directed to the attraction of investment into Latrobe City:

That Council:

- Authorise the Chief Executive Officer to reinvest any revenue generated from the sale of the lots on the Gippsland Logistics Precinct to fund the enabling infrastructure to complete the development of the precinct; and
- 2. Agree that any revenue generated from the sale of the lots that exceeds the total cost to complete the enabling infrastructure on the Gippsland Logistics Precinct be directed to the attraction of investment into Latrobe City.

It is proposed that these proceeds also be allocation the Transition Reserve if and when realised.

These additional allocations to the Reserve would support delivering on Councillors identified Focus Area Aspiration for a \$25m investment in *Infrastructure Vision*, which will deliver on Strategic Direction One, Our Economy in the Council Plan. The Reserve could support the delivery of projects that align to this aspiration including the implementation of the housing strategy, economic development strategy, industrial and employment strategy.

1. Background

The Latrobe City Council (Council) Transition Reserve (the Reserve) was established in the annual Council Budget to further support the organisation's long term financial sustainability and transition programs. This policy provides a detailed framework as to how the Reserve will be utilized to encourage diversification of the Latrobe City economy and the delivery of additional sustainable long term employment, through facilitating the development of enabling economic infrastructure.

The Reserve is evidence of Council's commitment to increasing employment opportunities throughout the municipality.

This Policy relates to the following Strategic Direction and Key Objective from the Council Plan 2025-2029.

Our Economy - Investment, Jobs, Growth

We are committed to working with our community and key stakeholders to grow our local economy to provide a wide range of job opportunities, economic diversification, and attract investment.

Key Objective 1 - Investment

Actively pursue investment in emerging industries and industries that diversify our local economy to create jobs and increase economic growth.

To support the Strategic Direction and Key Objective in the Council Plan, Councillors have identified a Focus Area Aspiration for a \$25m investment in *Infrastructure Vision*. The Reserve could support the delivery of projects that align to this aspiration including housing strategy, small town structure plans, economic development strategy, industrial and employment strategy.

2. Objectives

To provide a detailed framework for the expenditure of the Reserve in order to ensure it is allocated transparently, responsibly and in accordance with economic priorities for Latrobe City, with a focus on delivering optimal economic and community benefit and supporting sustainable local development.

3. Scope

This Policy applies to all Councillors, Council employees and all contractors engaged by Council. It is specifically targeted at enabling economic infrastructure to be established by Council that will support development of new industries, expansion of existing industries, enabling population growth and generation of employment opportunities in Latrobe City.

4. Principles of management

4.1 Use of Funds

- The purchase of land for economic development outcomes; or
- As leverage for State or Federal Government funding; or
- The development of land and/or enabling infrastructure for economic development outcomes or;
- Promotion, marketing and legal assistance to support the purchase and development of land for economic development purposes.

4.2 Eligibility

Transition Reserve Policy | Page 3

- Eligible projects must demonstrate:
 - · how they will contribute to a significant increase in the:
 - · number and diversity of job opportunities; and
 - · establishment of business and industries.
- through a business case, the economic benefits to the community through direct and indirect sustainable jobs. This will include, at minimum:
 - · detailed analysis of market opportunities;
 - · tangible deliverables and capability to deliver the proposal; and
 - an implementation strategy.

4.3 The following will not be considered for funding:

- projects that provide a direct financial contribution to an individual company;
- projects that do not demonstrate a sustained increase in local employment and economic activity;
- recurrent costs (e.g., operating, maintenance and office costs such as rent, insurance, telephone etc.);
- · salaries and other employment costs of new or existing staff;
- activities that would be undertaken in the normal course of Council business such as maintenance and upgrade; or
- · projects that are outside Latrobe City.

4.4 Approvals

In providing funding through this Policy, the ability to flexibly enter into reasonable commitments is important to take advantage of appropriate opportunities and to ensure the Reserve can be utilised in a commercially driven manner as intended.

To meet these objectives, a report will be prepared detailing a business case for expenditure, for consideration by Council. Council will decide whether to support an allocation from the Reserve.

4.5 Benefit Assessment

Each proposed investment by the Reserve will be assessed on a case by case basis. A Business Case for the investment will be prepared to support the request.

In determining the level of support from the Reserve, the following factors will be considered:

- alignment with Council's Strategic Direction and Key Objective 1 Investment;
- alignment with Economic Development Strategy Pillars;
- number of direct jobs created;
- number of indirect jobs;
- · likely sustainability of jobs created;
- industry type(s);
- · value of new investment leveraged from the Reserve investment;
- · diversification of the local economy;
- · strategic linkages to other industries; and
- Social Licence impact.

A Benefit Assessment Evaluation Matrix is attached in Appendix 1.

CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT COMMUNITY OUTREACH UPDATE

PURPOSE

To seek support for the development of a community outreach model to manage antisocial behaviour and improve community safety.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This report responds to a decision of Council to defer this matter, including the motion passed from the September 2025 Council Meeting to the current November 2025 Council Meeting.
- The development of a community outreach program in Central Business Districts (CBD) in Latrobe City is proposed to reduce anti-social behaviour and improve community safety in high traffic areas, such as CBD's and transport hubs. The program would work by directing people to appropriate support services by offering flexible outreach to community members at locations like the Morwell Transit Hub, and potentially other high-risk locations.
- Community Connectors had been presented to Council as a model to address community safety concerns in the Morwell CBD. Officers propose to investigate similar, but more localised program options, resulting in a custom model for Latrobe City.
- Advocacy efforts by Councillors have generated interest in community safety improvements in Latrobe City. Officers are seeking to coordinate the Minister for Police and Community Safety, and the Police Commissioner to visit Latrobe City and further discuss the community safety issues.
- Officers presented a recommendation to allocate \$30,000 from the accumulated
 cash reserve to develop a model at the September 2025 Council Meeting. A
 motion was passed to provisionally allocate this amount and defer the report
 until no later than the November 2025 Council Meeting, in anticipation of a visit
 to Latrobe City by the Minister for Police.
- The Minister for Police has not confirmed a meeting with Latrobe City to date.
 Contact was made with their office in October, with no response provided.
- It is suggested that development of a model can commence and should a
 meeting with the Minister for Police be held, the information gathered will be
 given due regard.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. allocates \$30,000 from the accumulated unallocated cash reserve to develop a localised community outreach program model aimed at improving community safety and addressing anti-social behaviour in Latrobe City's CBDs; and
- 2. receives a report at a future Council meeting, considering the localised model and options for its implementation.

BACKGROUND

Community safety is influenced by a range of factors. It can be real risks to safety through criminal offending or poor perceptions of safety due to things like antisocial behaviour or low levels of foot traffic.

Initial research identified that the Community Connectors program had been utilised in similar environments to pro-actively address some of the drivers of antisocial behaviour and offending, including poor mental health, alcohol or drug use and poor social connections. The key to success in the model has been the recruitment of outreach workers, and this idea could be adapted to develop a localised model suited to Latrobe City's needs.

At the February 2025 Council meeting, Council endorsed officers to seek funding for this program. A motion was also passed at the March 2025 Council meeting to receive a report on the implementation of the program.

At the May 2025 Council meeting, a detailed analysis of community safety issues pertaining to Morwell's CBD, and the Community Connectors program was provided (summarised below):

Morwell faces ongoing economic and social challenges impacting on community safety, with a 15% rise in crimes against the person, property and deception crimes and a 38% increase in drug offences between 2019-20 and 2023-24.

Council has acted by forming an internal working group, partnering with Victoria Police for joint patrols, business development initiatives and the CBD Presentation Blitz.

An outline of the Community Connectors program model was provided, which proposes the deployment of two trained community practitioners to the Morwell Transit Hub in Commercial Road.

The Community Connectors program, as rolled out in Frankston and Dandenong, has improved safety, reduced antisocial behaviour and optimised resource use with strong support from residents and businesses.

In considering the report at the May 2025 Council meeting, Council resolved:

That the report be deferred until no later than the September 2025 Council meeting for decision, pending receipt of feedback from the Victorian Minister for Police and Community Safety, the Hon. Anthony Carbines MP.

In considering the report at the September 2025 Council meeting, Council resolved:

Defers the report until no later than the November 2025 Council Meeting, pending a visit to Latrobe City by the Minister for Police and Community Safety to discuss the specific planning to address community safety in CBD areas; and

Provisionally allocates from the residual Accumulated Unallocated Cash Reserve an amount of \$30,000 whilst awaiting the report to be presented by no later than the November 2025 Council Meeting.

ANALYSIS

Following Council's May 2025 resolution, Officers provide the following update:

Advocacy

The formalisation of community safety as a priority of Council has occurred, following the adoption of the 2025-29 Council Plan and Advocacy Strategy at the June 2025 Council meeting.

Advocacy letters were sent prior to the May 2025 Council Meeting to the Victorian Minister for Police and Community Safety, the State Acting Chief Commissioner of Police and the Attorney General. Whilst these letters have not yet received a response, the Mayor and Deputy Mayor attended a delegation to State Parliament on 31 July 2025. It included a meeting with the Minister for Police and a roundtable with members of the Opposition including the Shadow Minister for Police and Community Safety. These meetings were successful in ensuring that community safety matters are now clearly understood by the State Government with a two-fold approach comprised of crime enforcement and prevention actions proposed.

As a follow up to the delegation, officers are seeking to coordinate a visit to Latrobe City by the Minister for Police and Community Safety, and the Police Commissioner to further discuss the concerns and potential solutions. To support this, and future advocacy efforts, a program plan is being developed utilising methods that were successful in other local government areas, including the Community Connectors program.

The Minister for Police has not confirmed a meeting with Latrobe City to date. Contact has been made with their office in October 2025, with no response provided to date.

Funding Options

In the absence of grant funding, Council would need to seek a financial commitment through the State or Federal Budgets, with officers recommending the State Government as the most appropriate and likely avenue.

To strengthen the likelihood of securing State Government commitment to the program, Council is asked to consider allocating funding of \$30,000 to resource the initial research and planning phase.

If Council successfully secures commitment through a future State Budget, funding would likely not be available until May 2026 at the earliest. To improve the likelihood of obtaining State Government support, Council may consider seeking joint seed funding from a partner organisation such as V/Line.

A more detailed program plan and scope will increase the likelihood of attracting funding.

The Outreach Model

A key factor in the potential success of a Community Connectors type program, as demonstrated through the Frankston and Dandenong examples, is an engaged partnership network, and suitably skilled outreach workers. Since Council last considered the Community Connectors program, officers contacted local agencies who may have the expertise and interest in partnering with Council to implement Community Connectors. The organisations contacted were:

- Anglicare;
- Wellways manage The Wes (wellbeing and emotional support hub);
- Uniting Vic Tas;
- Quantum Support Services; and
- NEAMI National manage the Latrobe Mental Health and Wellbeing Local.

Officers have held off on meeting with these organisations to discuss their interest and capacity to be involved, pending a decision of Council.

It is proposed that the project is broken down into stages, commencing with detailed program development. This stage would focus on building a contextual analysis, setting clear objectives and deliverables while identifying constraints, assumptions and exclusions. This would also enable further commitments to be sought from potential delivery partners (as outlined above).

Council is not currently resourced to deliver this work, and it is estimated that a budget of \$30,000 would be required. This would enable the organisation to temporarily assign resources to build on the success and learnings of the Community Connectors program rolled out in Frankston and Dandenong in developing a localised approach to address our community needs.

Support to further advocate to State and Federal Governments to fund the finalised Latrobe City program model, once developed, would then be requested of Councillors.

Update on Community Safety in Morwell's CBD

Based on recent observations, the immediate community safety experience in Morwell's CBD appears to have improved to some extent. This could be attributed to a combination of factors, including the colder weather discouraging congregation outside in public areas, increased police presence during an extended high-profile trial from May to July 2025, and the public space interventions undertaken by the City Presentation team. Officers will continue to monitor and observe the situation through the spring and summer months to assess whether these anecdotal improvements are sustained. The development of an outreach model would take into consideration current community safety concerns in CBDs across the municipality.

It is noted that there has been an increase of antisocial incidents occurring at public facilities including the Morwell Library over the same period. These have been addressed by the relevant teams from an Occupational Health and Safety perspective, as well as community perspective with the 'Coffee with a Cop' program. This program was held during July, enabling community members to see increased police presence in the Morwell Library and discuss their safety concerns directly with police officers.

Concurrently, Business Development activities including the Opportunity Awaits and Business Improvement District Development have progressed, targeting the CBD's retail environment.

The Latrobe City Community Safety Advisory Committee has also updated its Terms of Reference, endorsed at the 28 July 2025 Council Meeting, which strengthens Latrobe City's partnership with Victoria Police and expands the ability of the Committee to run community safety projects.

CONSULTATION

Regular information is shared through the business community and state government agencies via the Latrobe City Community Safety Advisory Community and engagements with Advance Morwell.

COMMUNICATION

The public prominence of community safety concerns in the Morwell CBD is likely to require ongoing communication with the public and stakeholders to ensure those interested understand their concerns are being heard and Council is working to address them.

Officers will continue to monitor appropriate opportunities to keep the community informed of Council's efforts to address community Safety.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Officers preparing this report have declared they do not have a conflict of interest in this matter under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 2020*.

APPENDIX 1 IMPACT ASSESSMENT

Gender

A Gender Impact Assessment under the *Gender Equality Act 2020* will be completed on a *Community Outreach* project as a key part of any program development. Gendered experiences of community safety have been considered to date, particularly data gathered from the 2021 YourGround survey. The survey identified particular locations of concern in Latrobe City, including a large number of submissions for the Morwell Transit Hub.

Social

Community safety concerns are in large partly driven by social disadvantage. A *Community Outreach* program aims to support community to access social services. Data gathered which identifies the need for the project demonstrates that Latrobe City residents rank 4th highest in the state for not feeling valued by society and that 16% of residents live in poverty.

Cultural

People from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds may perceive greater risks to safety than the general community. A *Community Outreach* program will ensure we have skills to communicate with culturally diverse communities.

Health

Social and health issues are often linked, and Morwell's CBD serves as a hub across Gippsland for a large number of health and social support services. The Community Outreach program aims to support greater access to such services, overall improving the health outcomes of community members. Data gathered which identifies the need for the project demonstrates that 20% of Latrobe City residents have high or very high levels of mental distress and are 43% more likely than the Victorian average to have a mental health condition.

Environmental

There are no environmental sustainability impacts of either project. Both the advocacy and *Community Outreach* project aim to create a more socially inclusive and sustainable community environment, both built and civic.

Economic

There is likely to be an opportunity cost of Council not progressing any community safety measures outside current means, however without detailed analysis this cannot be accurately measured. For example, it is likely that retail economic performance in the Morwell CBD will continue to decline, along with foot-traffic and the passive surveillance that enables.

Financial

Officers are seeking \$30,000 from the unallocated cash reserve to enable the organisation to assign a temporary resource to develop customised community outreach program. As part of this work, we will develop a more accurate costing of the annual costs to deliver an Outreach Program.

MORWELL RECREATION RESERVE - TURF CRICKET PITCHES

PURPOSE

To present a report for Council decision on the provision and use of Morwell Recreation Reserve (MRR) as a multi-sport facility with consideration to its role as Council's Regional Centre of Excellence for Football.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The current use of MRR is guided by Council's Sporting Reserve and Pavilion Seasonal Licence (Licence) process, with users required to apply for a Licence to use the facility in line with their competitive season. Seasons are defined as:
 - Summer Licence period 1 October to 31 March; and
 - Winter Licence period 1 April to 30 September.
- The Licence is the only form of Council documentation prescribing use of MRR between winter and summer seasons.
- Morwell Cricket Club (MCC) are recognised as the primary summer Licence holder and Morwell Football Netball Club (MFNC) and Gippsland Power (GP) the primary and secondary winter Licence holders, respectively. Currently, there are no further documents regarding the facility's use with consideration to its status as Council's Regional Centre of Excellence for Football (RCEF).
- During the redevelopment of MRR, representatives of GP and MFNC requested the removal of the turf wickets, however the issue remains unresolved.
- Between both MRR and Keegan Street Reserve (KSR), there are currently eight turf cricket pitches across three different wicket blocks:
 - Two, two pitch blocks at MRR; and
 - One, four pitch block at KSR.
- Following written correspondence to Council from winter Licence holders regarding this matter, Councillors requested that Officers undertake consultation with MCC, MFNC and GP regarding the future of turf cricket pitches on MRR.
- Officers have held multiple in person consultative sessions with representatives from winter and summer Licence holders, to explore alternative options to enable a multi-sport existence within MRR.

- Post further feedback received at the 5 November Councillor Briefing, Officers
 present the following Options for Councillor consideration, with respect to
 financial requirements now and ongoing into the future:
 - 1. Removal of all turf pitches, replace with a synthetic pitch with Council responsible for annual covering and uncovering of the pitch with natural turf;
 - The status quo remains, with the addition of Council undertaking annual maintenance and renovation works to aid in MRR's position as Council's RCEF;
 - 3. Consolidate the existing cricket pitches on MRR from four to two with an additional pitch built into the existing wicket block at KSR;
 - 4. The complete removal of cricket pitches from MRR enabling MRR to be available for all football activities as they arise; and,
 - 5. Consolidate the existing cricket pitches on MRR from four to three in a single wicket block.
- Additional surface hardness testing undertaken by Officers indicates Option
 One (detailed above) meets the requirements for surface hardness thresholds
 prescribed by the AFL, however there are no known ovals utilising this method
 for football at Coates League, VFL/VFLW or AFL/AFLW level.
- With consideration to the content of this report, Officers recommend Option
 Three (detailed above), coupled with the installation of a subsurface drainage
 system into KSR and the implementation of an MOU to recognise MRR's
 position as Council's RCEF, as the most balanced and financially sustainable
 option.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- resolves to consolidate the existing turf cricket pitches on Morwell Recreation Reserve from two separate two turf pitch blocks to one single two turf pitch block west of centre;
- 2. resolves to install one additional turf pitch into the existing wicket block at Keegan Street Reserve;
- 3. resolves to install a full-field subsurface drainage system in Keegan Street Reserve;
- 4. notes the capital budget required for items 1, 2 and 3 of this recommendation, of \$250,000;
- 5. notes the requirement for a Memorandum of Understanding to be developed and executed by all Seasonal Licence holders of Morwell Recreation Reserve, recognising its status as Council's Regional Centre

- of Excellence for football;
- 6. notes the ongoing operating expense of \$10,000 per annum for the annual renovation and maintenance of a single two turf pitch block at Morwell Recreation Reserve; and
- 7. notes the execution of this resolution is contingent on the required budget allocations being endorsed through a future budget process.

BACKGROUND

MRR is the historical home of Morwell Cricket Club (MCC), Morwell Football Netball Club (MFNC) and Gippsland Power (GP) with cricket and football played at the venue since the 1920's and 1930's respectively.

Use of MRR is guided by Council's Sporting Reserve and Pavilion Seasonal Licence (Licence) process, with users required to apply for a Licence to use the facility in line with their competitive season. Seasons are defined as:

- Summer Licence period 1 October to 31 March; and
- Winter Licence period 1 April to 30 September.

MCC are recognised as the primary summer Licence holder and MFNC and GP the primary and secondary winter Licence holders, respectively. Currently, there are no further documents regarding the facility's use with consideration to its status as Council's RCEF.

In 2020, Council endorsed MRR as Council's RCEF following the \$9 million redevelopment of the MRR precinct including Keegan Street Reserve (KSR), which commenced in the 2018/19 financial year.

During the redevelopment of MRR, representatives of GP and MFNC requested the removal of the turf wickets at the 21 June 2018 Project Reference Group (PRG) meeting (**Attachment 1**). This request was referred to Council's Sport and Recreation Team of the time, to facilitate discussions between User Groups, however the issue remains unresolved.

The subject of turf cricket pitches on MRR has been highly contentious since the commencement of the redevelopment works and the consequent adoption of MRR as Council's RCEF in 2020. Between both MRR and KSR, there are currently eight turf cricket pitches across three different wicket blocks:

- Two, two pitch blocks at MRR (layout of these blocks per Figure 1); and
- One, four pitch block at KSR.



Figure 1: Existing Morwell Recreation Reserve Cricket Pitch Layout

Both MFNC and GP have previously communicated to Council what they perceive to be the negative impact of the presence of turf cricket pitches on the playing of football at MRR and consequently its perceived inability to fulfill its role as Council's RCEF.

Previous attempts to achieve a satisfactory outcome for all users have been unsuccessful and attracted attention from the cricketing community, often through State or Federal Parliament representatives. In February 2024, Council received a joint letter from MFNC and GP (**Attachment 2**) highlighting their concerns regarding the impact of cricket pitches on the playing of football and the function of MRR as Council's RCEF, including perceived missed opportunities for the establishment of partnerships with AFL clubs and the hosting of major events.

Concerns identified within the letter are summarised below:

- Request the complete removal of turf cricket pitches from MRR noting the:
 - Perceived missed opportunities to host VFL and AFL fixtures.
 - Lack of cricket played at MRR to justify retention of turf cricket pitches.
 - Impact on football operations of both MFNC and GP, female football in particular.
 - Lack of maintenance to cricket pitches by MCC causing inconsistent surface levels and poor grass coverage through this part of MRR.

In September 2024 a Councillor Pathway (Request Number 1202082) was received via Mayoral and Councillor Support from a former Councillor, requesting further investigation into the concerns raised by MFNC and GP.

Consequently, Officers presented a report at the 7 April 2025 Councillor Briefing and were subsequently requested to undertake consultation with MCC, MFNC and GP to achieve a satisfactory outcome for all User Groups.

Noting the inclusion of the perceived missed VFL/AFL opportunities highlighted in the joint letter of 22 February 2024, Officers have undertaken additional consultation with Council's Events Team to understand what opportunities Council are currently pursuing with regards to the activation of MRR as Council's RCEF.

Advice received indicates there are currently no partnerships or events being pursued by Council's Events Team owing to the centralising of pre-season fixtures by the AFL. However, discussions have been held with one AFL Club, though these were ultimately unsuccessful in establishing of any partnership.

ANALYSIS

Post the receipt of feedback on the 7 April 2025 Briefing Report, Councillors and Officers met with MFNC and GP representatives on 24 April 2025 to better understand their concerns and commenced consultation with MCC on 13 May 2025 via an in-person meeting attended by Council Officers.

Minutes of this meeting with MCC can be found in **Attachment 3** with initial feedback from all User Groups summarised in the table below.

Post the outcome of initial consultation, Officers collated several options for consideration by all User Groups with a view to achieve consensus on an acceptable option for presentation to Council. Options are detailed below:

- 1. Removal of all turf pitches, replace with a synthetic pitch with Council responsible for annual covering and uncovering of the pitch with natural turf;
- 2. The status quo remains, with the addition of Council undertaking annual maintenance and renovation works to aid in MRR's position as Council's RCEF;
- 3. Consolidate the existing cricket pitches on MRR from four to two with an additional pitch built into the existing wicket block at KSR;
- 4. The complete removal of cricket pitches from MRR enabling MRR to be available for all football activities as they arise; and
- 5. Consolidate the existing cricket pitches on MRR from four to three in a single wicket block.

Whilst Options Two and Four do not achieve the compromise sought through the consultation process, Officers have advised User Groups of their inclusion in this report to ensure Councillors are provided with all possible Options for consideration.

Written feedback from all User Groups (**Attachment 4**) indicates Option One as their preference. For clarity, Officers have investigated the feasibility of Option One and found this has been implemented by multiple Local Governments and private schools across Victoria. Additional surface hardness testing undertaken by Officers indicates Option One meets the requirements for surface hardness thresholds prescribed by the AFL, however there are no known ovals utilising this method for football at Coates League, VFL/VFLW or AFL/AFLW level.

Subsequently, Officers sought independent comment on Option One from the Australian Sports Turf Managers Association (ASTMA) who is the leading professional association for turf management in Australia, and who the AFL has engaged for previous AFL sanctioned events at MRR and Ted Summerton Reserve, regarding compliance relating to surface condition, hardness and general safety. Their summation of option one concludes:

- The theory of this Option appears sound;
- Seeing no reason why an AFL/AFLW match may not proceed on such a surface; and
- Noting that the supply and installation of ready-to-play turf comes at a significant cost, with 200m² likely exceeding \$30,000.

Please note Option One would be working to a proposed area of 203m2. ASTMA's full comment on Option One can be found in **Attachment 5**.

Additional feedback provided by all User Groups is detailed in the table below.

MCC have identified rectification of the poor drainage capabilities of KSR as a requirement for their Club. This will more closely align the drainage capabilities of KSR with those found on MRR and enhance KSR's ability to host early season cricketing fixtures which are often impacted by the fluctuating spring weather.

The improvement of drainage on KSR will also increase its capabilities to host winter sport with AFL Gippsland previously identifying the activation of KSR as a strategic priority for them. Consequently, any drainage upgrade will likely require the quarantining of KSR against its use for football, noting the guaranteed impact to the quality of cricket pitches on KSR, the existing synthetic oval within the precinct for winter sport use, and to avoid a repeat of the issue currently being navigated.

Summary

Noting the pre-existing preferred Options of User Groups (Two and Four), Officers consider there to be four viable Options for consideration with these detailed within the table below.

Officers acknowledge the final Options provided in this report (per Table 3) require a commitment of funding by Council and believe it is important that all Options are considered through the lens of sound financial decision making, the use of MRR as a community sports facility, its role as Council's RCEF and the budget impacts of one-off capital expenses versus recurring annual operating expenses.

Consequently, whilst User Groups preference is Option One, it is reasonable to suggest that Option Three enables Council to achieve a similar outcome in a less restrictive financial manner.

Additionally, Officers believe it is important to weigh the priority of MRR as the RCEF and the opportunities a facility favouring football provides against MRR's historic role as a community sporting facility. Regardless of the Option endorsed by Council, Officers intend to implement an accompanying MOU to aid in managing User Group relationships and expectations, to enhance MRR's ability to fulfill its role as Council's RCEF.

APPENDIX 1 IMPACT ASSESSMENT

Gender

The removal of or amended arrangements for turf pitches at MRR would enable increased football activities, in turn improving the ability to host elite sporting events and increase the cohesiveness of footballing programs and social connection of those participating, additionally this would increase the opportunities for members of the local and broader Gippsland community to get together in support of footballing activities.

Although spectator and participation figures are significantly lower, the removal of the turf pitches would inhibit the ability for simultaneous cricket fixtures to be held at MRR and KSR, in turn reducing social connection experienced amongst the cricket community.

Cultural

Sport plays a significant role in the culture of Latrobe City, the continued ability to host major sporting events of both a local and professional level is important in consolidating this culture.

Health

Sport plays an important role in the physical and mental health of all community demographics. The removal of or adoption of alternative arrangements for the turf pitches would provide the opportunity for additional footballing activities and reduce any obstructions to the hosting of future major sporting events. Additional community usage and hosting of major sporting event provides further opportunities for the community to come together and connect.

Environmental

Not applicable.

Economic

Major sporting events at both a local and elite level provide significant positive economic impact, the most recent football final held at MRR contributed over \$300,000 to the local economy.

Financial

All options available to Council are currently unfunded and are dependent on the endorsement of a budget allocation.

User Group Feedback

Morwell Cricket Club

Option 1

- We do not believe the reduction of the current situation to a single turf wicket block of 2 pitches will benefit either of the resident sporting clubs or the actual presentation of the oval itself at all. The lack of ability to rotate preparation and usage of the 2 pitches during summer could basically result in bare rolled turf soil through wear and tear, well before the end of cricket season. Also, the transition periods between sporting seasons of winter to summer and summer to winter are potentially longer due to the need to properly address regrowth of the specific type of grass used on the wicket block centre of the ground. Even with the current two separated 2 turf wicket blocks, we are looking at self-funding restoration and repairs to the existing pitches for the coming season, so with a single turf wicket block, that would be a much greater and more expensive task.

Option 2

– Similarly to Option 1 response, we believe a 3rd wicket on a single turf bench would still be insufficient to support proper pitch rotation. And if the turf wicket block of 3 pitches were to be placed geometrically off-centre to accommodate the winter football centre bounce requirements and moved either longitudinally towards the goal ends or laterally towards the shorter wing boundaries, the size of the ground from a summer cricket perspective would be diminished in terms of playing dimensions and profile. The current scenario of the existing two separated turf wicket blocks of 2 pitches each, is already right at the absolute limit of reasonable pitch location for Senior Men's cricket.

Option 3

– The geometrically central location of a synthetic hard wicket to be covered for the winter football season with natural turf matching the rest of the oval surface and then uncovered for the summer cricket season by Council, is our preferred option. It benefits both sporting tenants of the facility in that the centre of the ground, which is key to both sports, is available for use very quickly, with little inconvenience from any sporting footprint left behind from the prior sporting club's usage. The transition period between sporting seasons can be also managed by Council much more efficiently in both seasonal directions.

- Given that Morwell Cricket Club has 3 Senior Men's teams, 1 Senior Women's Team and generally 6 Junior Teams, having a synthetic wicket on the Morwell Recreation Reserve main oval, will allow for greater mid-week usage of the main oval during the summer by the Junior and Women's Teams, especially when turf wicket preparation is underway on the Keegen Street Reserve. This is as well as weekly Saturday matches for our Senior Men's B and C Grade teams being played on the main oval. We consider it a necessity to have 2 ovals adjacent to each other to effectively cater for our members usage & keeping our senior men, senior womens and juniors together due to all of our training facilities, our office, our canteen and our social rooms being located on the Morwell Recreation Reserve. The use of Northern Reserve as a secondary ground for the lower Men's grades and Junior grades of the club, while a reasonable backup option, has the problem that we can only to supply the bare minimum of amenities there for our playing members and the opposing teams. This can impact strongly on our retention rate of players, most especially Junior players and their parents.
- And should there happen to be other non-cricket, special public events such as AFL demonstration or practice matches scheduled by Council on the ground in the summer season, there is no extended loss of use of the ground to the tenant club before the public event as has been the case in the past. The event can be planned for and the ground quickly adjusted for an all-grass event if necessary.

Morwell Football Netball Club

The preferred option of Morwell FNC is subject to:

- 1. Relevant details of each available option being reviewed and approved by the club
- 2. The associated MoU for the football oval usage going forward, specifically with respect to the oval's status as the AFL Centre of Excellence and the order of preference given to the various user groups and purposes
- 3. Any additional information not yet available to the club for consideration

Conditional upon the factors listed above the club's preference is:

Removal of both turf wicket blocks, to be replaced with a single synthetic wicket with Council responsible for covering/uncovering with natural turf.

As discussed, I am putting together options regarding the future of turf wickets on Morwell Recreation Reserve and an option being considered is to remove all turf wickets and install a single synthetic wicket to be covered with ready to play natural turf for football. The scope of which is:

- Synthetic wicket 25m x 3m & 90mm below surface of surrounding outfield.
- · Agi drain line installed the length of the synthetic wicket, either side of the synthetic wicket

When covered:

- Wicket covered with black plastic & ready to play Santa Ana couch which is then oversown for winter sport.
- The turf covering will extend to 29m x 7m to ensure surface levels.

Please can you provide advice on this proposal with consideration to the requirements for AFL and the hosting of AFL/AFLW fixtures including the shortest possible timeframe acceptable for the turf to be installed. (I.e., Can cricket be played upto Jan 15th if an AFL/AFLW fixture was scheduled on Feb 1st?).

I have put together a sample plot and tested using a Clegg hammer with results shown below:

The proposed concept is unique and unlike anything we've previously encountered. However, in theory, it appears sound—particularly in relation to the test plot. In relation to the timeframe before an AFL/AFLW match, using ready-to-play turf would allow for a short turnaround, provided the turf is secured from the supplier and installed promptly. A 7–10 day window should be achievable. If the works are completed to a high standard, I see no reason for an AFL/AFLW match not to proceed. It should be noted that the supply and installation of ready-to-play turf comes at a significant cost, with 200 m² likely exceeding \$30,000.

SALES PROCESS UPDATE - TONERS LANE. MORWELL (TITLE VOLUME 12520 FOLIO 257)

PURPOSE

To seek Council endorsement to proceed to sell the Council owned property, Volume 12520 Folio 257 on Toners Lane, Morwell following a community consultation process.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- At the August 2022 Council Meeting, Council resolved to give public notice of and seek submissions on Council's intention to sell an estimated 24 acres (8.92 hectares) of Council owned land at Toners Lane.
- A community engagement process occurred from 26 October to 22 November 2022, Council received no submissions on the matter.
- The subdivision process was completed December 2023, this involved the payment of the public space contribution of \$288,000 and the new titles (Lot 1 PS 910220 / Title Volume 12520 Folio 257) have since been issued – see Attachment 1.
- An updated valuation has been received from an independent licenced valuer and is attached as Confidential Attachment 2.
- Officers are preparing the property to be ready and available for sale including new boundary peg markings and slashing.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. having not received any submissions, resolves to sell (Lot 1 PS 910220 on parent title Volume 12384 Folio 081) Toners Lane, Morwell by Expression of Interest, Auction or Private treaty; and
- authorises the Chief Executive Officer to execute all documents 2. necessary to offer the Lot 1 PS 910220 Toners Lane, Morwell for sale by **Expression of Interest, Auction or Private Treaty and to complete the sale** at a price no less than the minimum selling price set in accordance with Confidential Attachment 2, or current market value where relevant.

BACKGROUND

The Morwell West Development Plan identified a portion of Council owned Toners Lane reserve, to be developed for residential purposes.

At the 1 August 2022 Council meeting, Council resolved:

That Council:

- Gives public notice of the proposed sale by private treaty of an estimated 24 acres (9.48 hectares) of vacant land ("the land") which forms part of the Morwell West Development Plan within Council land abutting Toners Lane, Madden Street, Godridge Road and Catherine Street, Morwell and invites public submissions on the proposal; and
- Considers at a future Council Meeting any submissions received that are opposed to the proposed sale of the land; or
- If no submissions opposed to the sale of the land are received, authorises the Chief Executive Officer to sell the land at no less than the current market value as assessed by independent valuation and to sign and seal any documents required to facilitate the transfer of land.

To facilitate the development plan Council has completed the subdivision process to divide the land for sale, this process was completed in December 2023 (**Attachment 1**).

As part of the subdivision process the Public Open Space contribution of \$288,000 was required to be paid by the landowner, Council has paid this contribution to finalise the subdivision. This contribution will be featured in the sales collateral as a benefit to purchasing this property.

Council completed the Community Engagement process from 26 October to 22 November 2022, Council received no submissions on the matter.

An updated valuation was received in October 2025 from an independent licenced valuer (**Confidential Attachment 2**).

ANALYSIS

Section 114 of the *Local Government Act 2020* requires Council publish a notice of an intention to sell land **Attachment 3** – Public Notice and undertake community engagement, with any submissions to be presented to Council at a subsequent meeting.

Council received no submissions regarding the potential sale and officers recommend proceeding with the sale of the parcel.

The subdivision process has now been completed, and a new title (Lot 1 PS 910220) has been issued for the parcel Council intends to sell.

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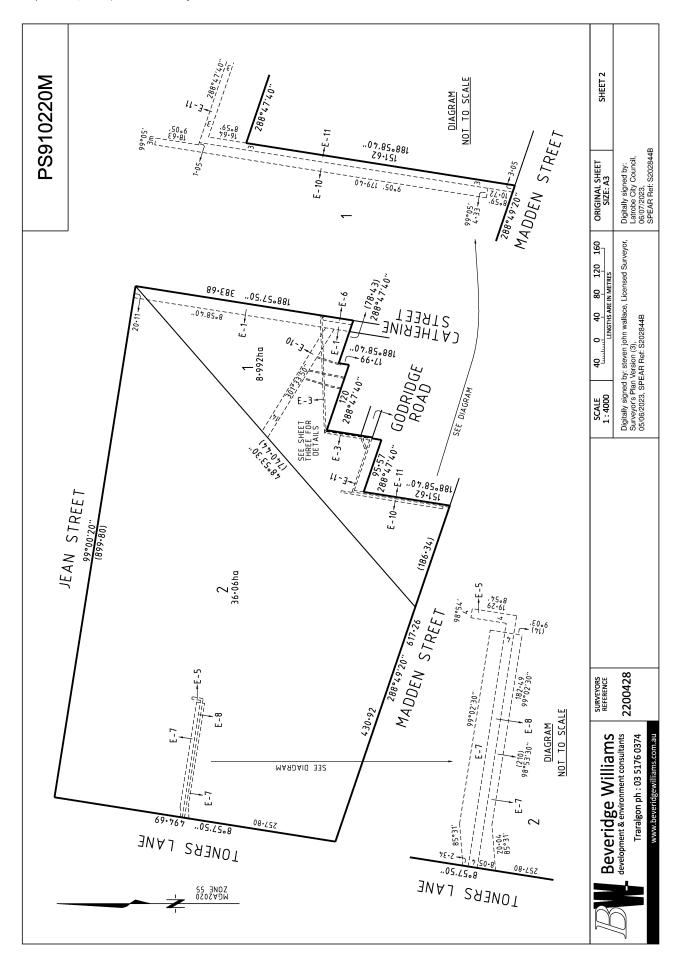
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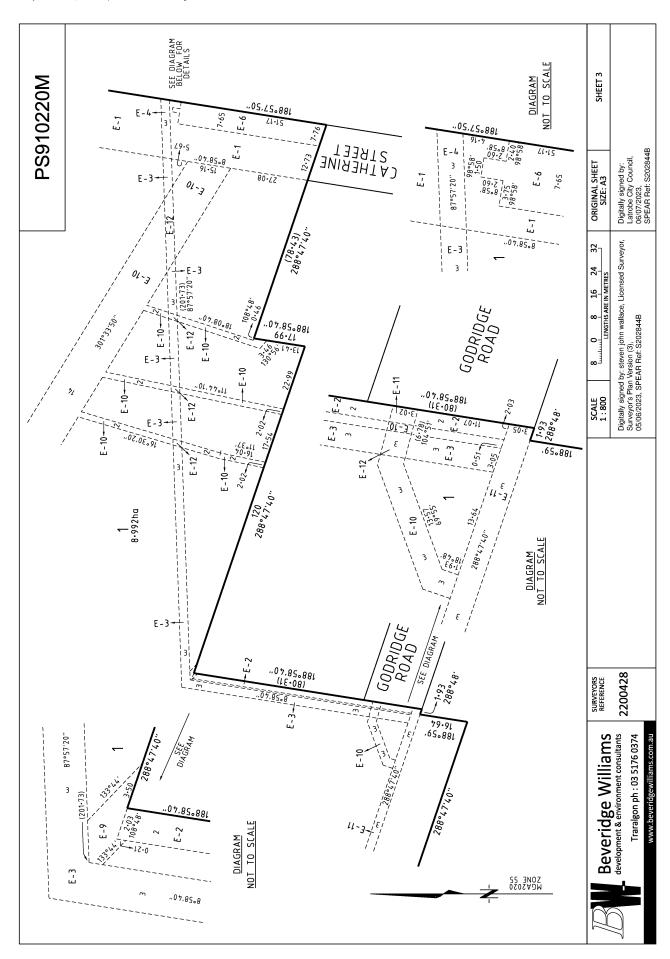

PURPOSE

To seek Council approval to submit funding applications to the 2025-26 Local Sports Infrastructure Fund and the 2026-27 Country Football Netball Program and allocate the required funding contributions.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The 2025-26 Local Sports Infrastructure Fund (LSIF) and the 2026-27 Country Football Netball Program (CFNP) are Victorian Government competitive grant programs, administered by Sport and Recreation Victoria (SRV).
- Only Local Government Authorities (LGAs) are eligible to apply, although clubs and associations are made aware of this funding through direct State Government communications.
- LSIF opened on 2 September 2025 and closes on 2 December 2025. CFNP opened 18 September 2025 and closes on 26 February 2026.
- LSIF is a statewide program offering the following three streams and maximum funding amounts:
 - Community Facilities \$500,000.
 - Community Sports Lighting \$250,000.
 - Planning \$40,000.
- CFNP is only available to rural and regional LGA's offering up to \$250,000 for AFL or netball infrastructure projects.
- The funding ratio for both funding programs is \$3:\$1 (SRV:Council).
- In line with the current Recreation Needs Assessment (RNA), the proposed applications are:

LSIF Community Facilities

- Netball and Tennis Changerooms (including public amenities) -Yinnar Recreation Reserve.
- Estimated cost: \$1,608,200.
- Estimated Council co-contribution: \$1,108,200.
- Proposed co-contribution source: Infrastructure Projects Reserve.

LSIF Community Sports Lighting

- Sports Lighting Stoddart Oval, Traralgon West Sporting Complex.
- Estimated cost: \$300,000.
- Estimated Council co-contribution: \$50,000.
- Proposed co-contribution source: Public Open Space Reserve.

LSIF Planning

- Large Town Recreation Reserve Master Plans.
- Estimated cost: \$50,000.
- Estimated Council co-contribution: \$12,500.
- Proposed co-contribution source: Council's Recreation and Open Space Planning Operational budget.

o CFNP

- Sports Lighting (oval) Duncan Cameron Memorial Park, Traralgon
- Estimated cost: \$335,000.
- Estimated Council co-contribution: \$53,750.
- Proposed co-contribution source: Public Open Space Reserve.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. endorses three applications to the 2025-26 Local Sports Infrastructure Fund:
 - 1.1. Netball and Tennis Changerooms at Yinnar Recreation Reserve;
 - 1.2. Sports Lighting at Stoddart Oval, Traralgon;
 - 1.3. Large Town Recreation Reserve Master Plans;
- 2. endorses an application to the 2026-27 Country Football Netball Program for Sports Lighting at Duncan Cameron Memorial Park, Traralgon; and
- 3. allocates \$1,108,200 from the Infrastructure Projects Reserve and \$103,750 from the Public Open Space Reserve as Council's contribution towards the Netball and Tennis Changerooms at Yinnar Recreation Reserve, and Sports Lighting at Stoddart Oval and Duncan Cameron Memorial Park, if application/s are successful.

BACKGROUND

The 2025-26 LSIF opened on 2 September 2025 and closes on 2 December 2025. The LSIF is a statewide program that provides funding for planning, upgrading and building essential sports facilities that will support and boost participation, particularly for less represented groups such as women and girls, Aboriginal Victorians, people with disability, culturally and linguistically diverse communities, LGBTIQA+ people and economically disadvantaged communities.

The 2026-27 CFNP opened on 18 September 2025 and closes on 26 February 2026. It provides funding to rural and regional LGA's for AFL and netball infrastructure projects and also has a strong focus on supporting opportunities for less represented groups.

The 2024-25 LSIF was only available to metropolitan councils, with rural and regional councils referred to the Regional Community Sports Infrastructure Fund (RCSIF) during this time. Following a successful application in Round One of the RCSIF, Council received \$1 million towards the delivery of a new multi-use pavilion at Gaskin Park, Churchill however were unsuccessful with both applications submitted in Round Two (Lift installation to the pavilion at Ronald Reserve, Morwell and Large Town Recreation Reserve Master Plans).

As the RCSIF is no longer available, the 2025-26 LSIF reverts to a statewide program, increasing the competitiveness of the program.

At a recent LSIF information forum hosted by SRV, the following considerations for potential applicants was presented:

- Funding programs have become highly competitive in recent years. High quality applications will stand out.
- Consider the number of applications being submitted and if this will impact their overall quality. Important to maintain a high level of quality across all applications.
- Consider the Investment Priorities within the Guidelines and how applications align with each of the priorities.
- Maximising budget contributions from Council and other sources (such as clubs, local organisations or other Governments/Departments).
- The number of overdue milestones by a Council and capacity to deliver new projects will be considered during the assessment for all applications.

Eligible projects for the 2025-26 LSIF are outlined in the table below:

At the September 2025 meeting, Council resolved to allocate \$3.4 million to the Infrastructure Projects Reserve which could be used for the \$1,108,200 co-contribution required for the Netball and Tennis Changerooms at Yinnar Recreation Reserve. This would leave a remaining balance of \$2,291,800.

If \$103,750 is allocated from the Public Open Space Reserve for the co contributions required for the two lighting projects at Stoddart Oval and Duncan Cameron Memorial Park, Traralgon's portion of the Public Open Space Reserve remaining balance will be \$1,372,315.

Project scope could be reduced to align with project budget/s.

2025-26 Local Sports Infrastructure Fund

About the Local Sports 1.1 Infrastructure Fund

The 2025-26 Local Sports Infrastructure Fund (the Fund) is a statewide competitive Victorian Government investment program. It provides funding to develop high-quality, accessible community sport and active recreation infrastructure.

The Fund promotes partnerships between the Victorian Government, Local Government Authorities (LGAs), Alpine Resorts Victoria (ARV), sporting clubs and associations, schools, educational institutions, and community organisations.

The Fund aims to increase and promote opportunities so Victorians can participate in ways that suit them and is targeted towards individuals and communities who participate less. This aligns with the strategic directions identified in Active Victoria 2022-2026: A strategic framework for sport and recreation in Victoria.

Sport and Recreation Victoria (SRV) administers the Fund, which is underpinned by the Department of Jobs, Skills, Industry and Regions' (DJSIR) priorities of driving a strong and resilient economy that benefits all Victorians. It does this by creating more opportunities for people through jobs and skills, supporting businesses and industries to grow and prosper, and building vibrant communities and regions.

1.2 Outcomes

The Fund reflects the Victorian Government's commitment to securing the many benefits of participating in sport and active recreation. This includes supporting Victorians, particularly those individuals and communities who participate less to achieve better health, wellbeing, social, and economic outcomes through the construction, programming and activation of community sport and active recreation infrastructure.

The Fund will invest in proposals that can demonstrate commitment to the following outcomes:

- provides additional participation opportunities through the development of multi-use community sport and active recreation infrastructure
- increased participation opportunities for individuals and groups who participate less, including socio-economically disadvantaged communities
- provides equitable and inclusive participation opportunities for women and girls in community sport and active recreation
- improved sustainable design and planning to ensure infrastructure investment is building better and more liveable communities
- increased local economic activity through the planning, building, management, and activation of redeveloped or new infrastructure.

1.3 Investment priorities

Priority will be given to projects that:

- · provide the strongest participation outcomes, including supporting existing participation, for groups that participate less in community sport and active recreation including women and girls, Aboriginal Victorians, people with disability, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities, people from LGBTIQA+ communities, and economically disadvantaged communities as identified in Active Victoria 2022-2026: A strategic framework for sport and recreation in Victoria
- support communities experiencing socio-economic disadvantage, particularly projects that support suburbs and towns within the 2 most disadvantaged deciles in Victoria as per the <u>Australian Bureau of Statistics Index</u> of Relative Socio-Economic Disadvantage, 2021
- support communities in areas of need that have experienced natural disasters (for example, drought affected areas, floods, bushfires) or communities experiencing strong population growth or significant change in circumstances (for example, economic challenges)
- demonstrate multi-use, shared and integrated facilities including those on school land that can ensure long-term community access. Please see Section 3.6 for information regarding facilities on school land
- provide a confirmed active recreation benefit through improved facility availability, scheduling, public access, and policy development (for projects with lighting elements)
- demonstrate economic uplift in the form of job creation during construction and operation, non-government investment and local event attraction.



Eligibility

2.1 Eligible applicants

Only **Victorian LGAs and ARV** are eligible to apply to the Fund.

In line with the Victorian Government's Fair Access Policy Roadmap, all Victorian LGAs must continue to have an acceptable gender equitable access and use policy (or equivalent) in place to be considered eligible for funding from the Program.

LGAs/ARV must discuss potential project/s with their SRV representatives to receive feedback on eligible projects before submitting their application/s.

Sport and recreation clubs, sporting associations and leagues, educational institutions, not-for-profit community organisations, businesses and individuals cannot directly apply to the Fund.

Local clubs, committees of management and organisations are advised to contact their LGA/ARV if they wish to express interest, seek support or be involved as a partner in applications to the Fund.

2.2 Eligible applications

Only eligible applications will be assessed and considered for funding by SRV.

To be eligible for funding, applications must:

- ensure the project scope and funding request adhere to the relevant funding stream requirements
- be able to demonstrate that the infrastructure project will be completed within 24 months of execution of a Grant Agreement with the DJSIR (for successful projects)
- exclude activities listed in <u>Section 7</u>
- be submitted (including all supporting documentation) by 5:00 pm on Tuesday 2 December 2025.

Each individual infrastructure project requires a separate application. Bundled projects will be deemed ineligible.

Stages of a larger facility development may seek support from the Fund, providing the stage addresses the assessment criteria and meets all other eligibility requirements. For a staged project, please provide information on the delivery of any future stages, including timelines.

3.3 Funding ratios

Funding ratios apply to the Fund as outlined in the table below.

Applicants must confirm matched funding consistent with the funding ratios for the applicable stream. Ratios are calculated using total project cost (**exclusive of GST**).

Applications may include project management fees of up to 7.5% of the total project cost (exclusive of GST).

Applications must include contingency that is a minimum 10% of the total project cost (exclusive of GST).

Applicants cannot use other State Government funding, such as funding from the Growing Suburbs Fund, as part of their local contribution throughout the delivery of the project.

Local contributions may comprise of funding from other organisations including LGAs/ARV, sport and recreation clubs, state sporting associations, schools, educational institutions, Federal Government, community organisations or in-kind support (limits apply to in-kind support).

3.4 In-kind contributions

An in-kind contribution is a contribution of a good or service other than money. Applications for infrastructure projects can claim in-kind expenses up to a maximum of 50% of the local contribution.

LGAs/ARV must approve and underwrite any in-kind contribution from third parties for each applicable application. Examples include voluntary labour, donated goods and donated services.

Applications that include in-kind contributions must provide:

- a completed in-kind and voluntary support form
- a letter from the LGA/ARV Chief Executive Officer that approves and underwrites any in-kind contributions.

3.5 Fair Access **Policy Roadmap**

All Victorian LGAs must continue to have an acceptable gender equitable access and use policy (or equivalent) in place to be considered eligible to receive community sport infrastructure funding, reflecting the Victorian Government's Fair Access Policy Roadmap (the Roadmap). The Roadmap is embedding a statewide foundation to improve the access to, and use of, community sports infrastructure for women and girls.

Policies ensure that women and girls can fully participate in and enjoy the benefits of community sport, with fair opportunity and access to their local community sport facilities.

3.6 Facilities on school land

LGAs are eligible to apply to the Fund for projects located on school land.

For projects on school land, applicants must provide a Community Joint Use Proposal which is completed by the applicant and the school and a letter from the Department of Education central office that endorses the project.

Projects on non-government school land are also eligible for funding and require a similar demonstration of commitment from both parties to ensure long-term community access is achieved under agreed terms.

3.7 Facilities on Crown land

LGAs are eligible to apply to the Fund for projects located on Crown land. Partnerships between LGAs, committees of management and other land managers for projects that support community sport and active recreation outcomes on Crown land are encouraged.



Funding streams

Community Facilities Stream

The Community Facilities Stream supports the development of a broad range of new, or redevelopment of existing, community sport and active recreation infrastructure ensuring all infrastructure is high-quality, multi-use and accessible to all. Refer to Section 3.1 for a list of eligible projects under the Community Facilities Stream.

4.1.1 Application details

As per Section 3.1, applicants may submit an unlimited number of applications but cannot exceed \$500,000 in total across all applications per LGA/ARV.

Applicants must respond to assessment criteria for the Community Facilities stream outlined in Section 4.1.2 and provide all the mandatory supporting documentation in Section 5. The quality of supporting documentation provided will also be considered during assessment.

Priority will be given to projects that can demonstrate alignment with the Investment Priorities as outlined in Section 1.3.

Each project requires a separate application under this stream. Bundled projects will be deemed ineligible.

4.2 Community Sports Lighting Stream

This Community Sports Lighting stream supports the installation of LED sports lighting infrastructure that increases facility capacity and participation opportunities. Refer to Section 3.1 for a list of eligible projects under the Community Sports Lighting Stream.

4.2.1 Application details

As per <u>Section 3.1</u>, applicants may submit an unlimited number of applications but cannot exceed \$250,000 in total across all applications per LGA/ARV.

Applicants must respond to assessment criteria for the Community Sports Lighting Stream outlined in <u>Section 4.2.2</u> and provide all the mandatory supporting documentation listed in <u>Section 5</u>. The quality of supporting documentation provided will also be considered during assessment.

Priority will be given to applications that clearly demonstrate a commitment to lighting that supports community sport and active recreation usage. For example, extending lighting hours beyond training sessions or on days where training is not held, for broader community and active recreation use (refer to the <u>Lighting outdoor sports facilities for active recreation</u>: <u>Research summary</u> for further information). Priority will also be given to projects that can demonstrate alignment with the Investment Priorities as outlined in <u>Section 1.3</u>.

Applications should also advise whether a power upgrade will be required onsite, or if the current power is suitable for the new lighting.

Each project requires a separate application under this stream. Bundled projects will be deemed ineligible.

4.3 Planning Stream

The Planning Stream provides support to undertake a range of specific facility and strategic planning projects that contribute to infrastructure readiness and/or the long-term direction of facility and open space. These projects are independent, consultative and improve sport and active recreation coordination to meet demand.

Refer to <u>Section 1.3</u> for a list of eligible projects under the Planning Stream. **Projects that deliver concept** plans will not be supported and deemed ineligible (refer to the Glossary).

4.3.1 Application details

As per <u>Section 3.1</u>, applicants may submit one Facility Planning or one Municipal Planning project per LGA/ARV up to \$40,000.

Applicants must respond to relevant assessment criteria for the Planning stream outlined in <u>Section 4.3.2</u> and provide all the mandatory documentation listed in <u>Section 5</u>. The quality of supporting documentation provided will also be considered during assessment.

Priority will be given to projects that can demonstrate alignment with the Investment Priorities as outlined in <u>Section 1.3</u>.

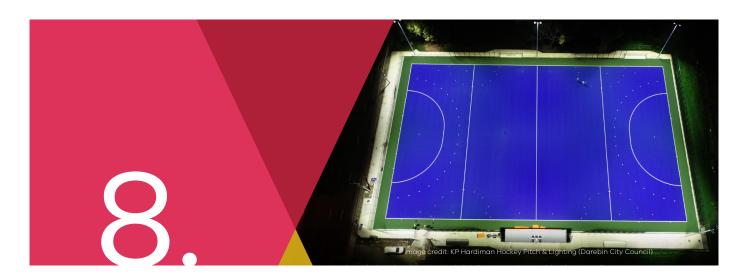
Types of activities that will not be funded

- Facilities where little or no public access
- Facilities without a primary purpose of community sport or active recreation.
- Projects that do not meet relevant sport or Australian Standards (for example, lighting projects). Facilities that do not comply with the relevant sport standard must seek exemption from the relevant sporting organisation and supply appropriate evidence to be supported by the Fund.
- The replacement of like-for-like surfaces (for example, synthetic surface replaced by a similar synthetic surface) are ineligible for funding. To be eligible for funding the application will need to demonstrate that additional uses are proposed and/or a multipurpose element is being introduced. Exceptional circumstances may be considered where significant safety or compliance issues are evident, and an activity will not continue to be conducted as a result. Applicants will need to provide a condition audit or other technical evidence demonstrating the safety or compliance issue.
- The purchase of land (in general, the land on which the facility development is proposed will be municipal property, a Crown reserve, land owned by a public authority, private land with public access rights or land held for public purposes by trustees).
- Requests for retrospective funding, where projects have started construction or are finished prior to the execution of a Grant Agreement (construction includes, but is not limited to demolition, site clearing, earthworks, building works and any form of early works).

- Buildings or equipment considered temporary or not permanent in nature or intended use for projects funded through the infrastructure streams.
- Metal halide lighting (only LED lighting systems will be funded).
- Upgrading or redeveloping kitchens or public toilet facilities, except as part of a larger project that meets the objectives of the relevant Fund stream.
- Requests for ongoing operational costs such as, but not limited to, salaries, electricity, water, asset maintenance and other utilities.
- Routine or cyclical maintenance works
- Purchasing or maintaining recreation, entertainment, sporting, lifesaving or any other equipment (except as part of facility fit out).
- Projects previously funded by SRV, unless applicants can demonstrate additional or new uses resulting in increased participation/ programming outcomes.
- Repair of facilities damaged by vandalism, fire or other natural disasters where the damage can be fully covered by insurance. The Fund may consider supporting applications where the scope includes elements that are not covered by insurance, or for amounts exceeding the value insured.
- In general, areas designated as licensed areas within a proposed facility will not be eligible for funding. DJSIR may consider applications where a restricted club license is proposed or in place, provided that the restricted license does not interfere with the facility's other amenities or services, such as childcare or access by young people.

- Tenant clubs that have failed to resolve a breach of the Fair Play Code.
- Applications for bundled projects where the one single application proposes to deliver multiple projects that will occur at different sites.
- Applications where the project beneficiary receives revenue directly from Electronic Gaming Machines will not be prioritised.
- For Facility Planning: other pre-planning documents (for example, Cultural Heritage Management Plan, Facility Asset Audits) or specific facility business case, advocacy documents or management plans. Projects that deliver concept plans (please refer to the Glossary).

- For Municipal Planning: single site master plans.
- For Facility Planning: other pre-planning documents (for example, Cultural Heritage Management Plan, Facility Asset Audits) or specific facility business case, advocacy documents or management plans. Projects that deliver concept plans (please refer to the Glossary).



Assessment Process

Only eligible applications submitted by eligible applicants will be assessed and considered for funding by SRV. Please refer to Section 2 for eligibility requirements and Section 6 for details about the application process.

SRV reserves the right to not assess an application should insufficient information be provided, including responses to assessment criteria and mandatory supporting documentation. SRV reserves the right to negotiate a lower than requested funding amount for submitted applications.

Applications will be considered against the assessment criteria by SRV staff and then reviewed by a Moderation Panel. The Moderation Panel will also consider the Investment Priorities outlined at Section 1.3 and in each stream before making recommendations to the Minister. Consideration will also be given to ensuring an equitable distribution of funding across Victorian regions.

SRV will also consider an applicant's past performance and the organisation's capacity to deliver projects on time. Compliance with past Grant Agreements and the number and duration of overdue milestones (including final acquittal and outcomes reports) for existing projects will also be considered, along with live projects with significant budget shortfalls.

Decisions regarding funding by the Minister for Community Sport are final and no further correspondence shall be entered into regarding such decisions.

LGAs/ARV are invited to seek feedback from SRV on unsuccessful applications.



Conditions that apply to funding

9.1 Grant Agreements

Successful applicants must enter a Grant Agreement with DJSIR with initial project payments made in the 2025–26 financial year.

The Grant Agreement will include reference to the following:

- recipients are responsible for all Project cost overruns
- the facility tenant club/s are expected to adhere to the Fair Play Code or related state sporting association Code of Conduct. More information can be found at <u>Fair Play Code</u>
- recipients may seek timing and/or scope variations for funded projects. Consideration of variations may lead to changes in deliverables, milestones, grant amount and payments
- LGAs/ARV must inform the participating organisation/s, where applicable, of all funding arrangements and obligations in relation to the grant allocation. This includes ensuring the funded project does not start prior to the execution of the Grant Agreement
- acknowledgement and Ministerial event requirements.

An LGA/ARV Officer must be designated to manage the project and provide information to DJSIR according to the following key reporting requirements:

- a Project Management Framework must be completed and submitted for all applications.
 Dates within the Project Management Framework will inform Grant Agreement milestones for successful projects.
- LGAs/ARV must secure SRV's endorsement of key documents such as schematic plans and architectural/planning briefs prior to works commencing. Projects must not start or be tendered until endorsement is provided. SRV may not make milestone payments if endorsement is not secured in a timely manner.
- LGAs/ARV must provide project acquittal documentation as required
- LGAs/ARV are expected to guarantee the cash flow payments towards works where a community organisation is providing funding contributions for a project
- LGAs/ARV must contribute information on activity outcomes for use in outcomes reporting, program evaluation reviews or DJSIR publications, 12 months after project acquittal.

A participation plan may be required for some applications funded. This will form part of the Grant Agreement. This will include details on how groups that participate less will be engaged and their participation facilitated.

9.2 Acknowledging the Victorian Government's support and promoting success

Successful applicants are required to acknowledge the Victorian Government's support through the Fund. Acknowledgement guidelines form part of the Grant Agreement and include the requirement that all activities acknowledge Victorian Government support through logo presentation on any activity-related publications, media releases, social media posts, and promotional material, and/or placing a Victorian Government endorsed sign at the site of infrastructure activities.

Details of requirements for funded projects are available in the <u>SRV: Infrastructure Grants Acknowledgement and Publicity Guidelines</u>.

Successful applicants may be required to contribute information on activity outcomes for use in program evaluation reviews or DJSIR's marketing materials.

9.3 Payments

Payments will be made conditional upon:

- the Grant Agreement having been signed by both parties
- milestones having been achieved to the DJSIR's satisfaction including provision of required/ requested information and reports to the satisfaction of the DJSIR.
- other terms and conditions of funding continue to be met.

A minimum of 5% of the grant will be paid upon financial acquittal of the project.

Payments advanced prior to completion are subject to refund if the Project is not performed in accordance with the Grant Agreement.

9.4 Privacy

DJSIR is committed to protecting your privacy. Any personal information about you or a third party in your application will be collected for the purposes of administering your grant application and informing the public of successful applications.

If there is an intention to include personal information about third parties in your application, please ensure they are aware of, and consent to the contents of this privacy statement.

Term	Definition
Access audit	An access audit is an assessment that rates a building for useability and accessibility for a wide range of users, including people with a disability. It identifies barriers or potential barriers to people with a disability accessing a building and using services inside and around the building.
Authorised Officer for Incorporated Clubs/ Organisations	An authorised officer for Clubs/Organisations is a designated individual/s with authority to act on behalf of the organisation in accordance with the Rules of Incorporation. This includes office bearers like President, Secretary or Treasurer.
Commencement of Works	The undertaking of any project activities that contribute to the physical construction of new infrastructure or upgrades, improvements, refurbishment of existing infrastructure as outlined in the application and supporting information. This includes, but is not limited to, site clearing, earthworks, building works and any form of early works.
Concept Plan	A concept plan serves as a starting point in the site development process. It provides preliminary drawings that convey the concept of the project but with insufficient detail to provide a basis for project costing.
Geotechnical Report	A geotechnical report is a site-specific sub-surface investigation undertaken by a geotechnical engineer. The document communicates ground conditions including soil, rock and groundwater which may inform earth works and construction
Lux Charts/ Lighting Plans	Site specific detailed plans that outline the lux (illumination) that will be exhibited across the court/field/pitch. Lighting plans including lux charts, pole locations, height and footings. These requirements are sport specific.
Master Plan	A master plan guides the development of a specific area, outlining the location of land uses, infrastructure, and community facilities. It is a high-level strategic document that informs future development and provides a list of priorities.
Participation	Participation is defined as engaging, coaching, officiating or volunteering in a sport or active recreation activity.
Participation Plan	A document populated prior to project finish demonstrating how participants, including under-represented groups will be engaged and their participation facilitated.

Term	Definition
Project Completion	Includes delivery of the approved project scope and submission of all milestone deliverables as per the Project Completion milestone within the Grant Agreement.
Quantity Surveyor (QS) Report	A Quantity Surveyor report is a cost plan estimating construction costs completed by a qualified Quantity Surveyor and based on schematic plans at a minimum.
Schematic Plan	For the purposes of this program, refers to scaled and labelled drawings produced by a professional designer or architect of an agreed development option. These will be site specific, include dimensions and measurement and spatial relationships. The plans are used to identify the project scope in sufficient detail to enable accurate project costings.

About the Country Football and Netball Program

The Country Football and Netball Program is a competitive Victorian Government investment program in partnership with the AFL, AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria that provides funding to rural, regional, and outer metropolitan councils to assist grassroots country football and netball clubs, associations, and umpiring organisations develop facilities.

Through the improvement of football and netball facilities in rural, regional, and outer metropolitan areas, the program will support the sustainability of country football and netball clubs into the future.

1.2. Why is the Victorian **Government supporting** these grants?

The Program was established in response to the Parliamentary Rural and Regional Services and Development Committee's Inquiry into Country Football Report, tabled in State Parliament in December 2004.

Improving football and netball facilities in rural, regional and outer metropolitan areas will support the regional and rural way of life and ensure the sustainability of country football and netball into

The Program promotes partnerships between the Victorian Government, AFL, AFL Victoria, Netball Victoria, Local Government Authorities (LGAs), country football and netball clubs, associations and umpiring organisations, schools, and community organisations.

Rates of participation in sport and active recreation are well below the state average for many groups of Victorians. This includes Aboriginal Victorians, people with a disability, seniors, disengaged youth, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities, women and girls and gender diverse people, LGBTIQ+ people and socio-economically disadvantaged communities.

Consistent with the strategic directions identified in Active Victoria 2022-26 the Victorian Government is committed to creating more opportunities for all Victorian individuals and communities who participate less.

The Program is underpinned by the Department of Jobs, Skills, Industry and Regions' (DJSIR) priority to ensure the state's economy benefits all Victorians by creating more jobs for more people, building thriving places and regions, and nurturing inclusive communities.

1.3. Outcomes

Football and netball are an integral part of regional life and the Victorian Government recognises the crucial role these sports play when it comes to participation in rural, regional and outer metropolitan communities.

This includes supporting Victorians, particularly those individuals and communities who participate less to achieve better health, wellbeing, social, and economic outcomes through the construction, programming and activation of community football and netball infrastructure.

The Program will invest in proposals that can demonstrate commitment to the following outcomes:

- develop new or maintain existing participation opportunities in football and/or netball, where there is a risk to participation declining
- improve diversity and inclusiveness in participation by prioritising projects that provide opportunities for communities that participate less (such as women and girls, gender diverse people, and people with a disability), as outlined in <u>Active Victoria 2022-2026</u>
- support gender equality in participation, coaching, administration, umpiring and volunteering
- improve physical and mental health, social and economic outcomes for traditionally disadvantaged communities such as low socioeconomic areas, growth areas, and communities experiencing long term disadvantage
- develop multi-use, shared and co-located facilities
- collaborate with AFL Victoria, Netball Victoria, or other relevant peak bodies.

1.4. Investment priorities

Priority will be given to projects that:

- provide the strongest participation outcomes, including existing participation, for groups that participate less in community sport and active recreation including women and girls, Aboriginal Victorians, people with disability, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities, people from LGBTIQA+ communities and economically disadvantaged communities as identified in <u>Active Victoria 2022-2026: A</u> <u>strategic framework for sport and recreation in</u> Victoria
- support communities experiencing socioeconomic disadvantage particularly projects that support suburbs and towns within the 2 most disadvantaged deciles in Victoria as per the <u>Australian Bureau of Statistics Index</u> of Relative Socio-Economic Disadvantage, 2021
- support communities in areas of need that have experienced natural disasters (for example, drought affected areas, floods, bushfires) or communities experiencing strong population growth or significant change in circumstances (for example, economic challenges)
- demonstrate multi-use, shared and integrated facilities including those on school land that can ensure long-term community access. Please see Section 3.6 for information regarding facilities on school land
- demonstrating economic lift in the form of job creation during construction and operation, non-government investment in the facility and participant and event attraction
- providing benefits for both football and netball.



Eligibility

2.1. Eligible applicants

Only LGAs are eligible to apply to the Program. These are limited to:

- Rural and regional LGAs
- Interface LGAs for facilities used by teams participating in leagues that are affiliated with an AFL Victoria Country League or a Netball Victoria Regional League or for facilities in areas where rurality can be demonstrated (Please refer to Section 2.2 Rurality, for further information)
- Frankston, Greater Dandenong and Kingston LGAs for facilities used by teams participating in an AFL Victoria Country League.

In line with the Victorian Government's Fair Access Policy Roadmap, all Victorian LGAs must continue to have an acceptable gender equitable access and use policy (or equivalent) in place to be considered eligible for funding from the Program.

Applications for projects where football or netball clubs participate in a New South Wales or South Australian league are eligible, provided the project will occur at a facility located in Victoria.

LGAs must discuss potential project/s with their SRV representatives to receive feedback on eligible projects before submitting their application/s.

Sport and recreation clubs, sporting associations and leagues, educational institutions, not-for-profit community organisations, businesses and individuals cannot directly apply to the Program.

Local clubs and organisations are advised to contact their LGA if they wish to express interest and seek support from the Program.

2.2. Rurality

Eligibility consideration under the rurality requirement only applies where other eligibility requirements are not met.

For the purposes of the program, rurality may be demonstrated if the facility location in the Interface LGA is outside of the Urban Growth Boundary, as outlined at <u>VicPlan</u>.

Where the location of land for a prospective project does not satisfy the above, an applicant may apply for funding if they can demonstrate the facility is located on land in a rural setting or in a township with predominantly rural or regional characteristics. This may include the following considerations:

- Facility is in a township with lower population and/or lower population density
- Facility is in a township neighbouring a rural and regional LGA
- Facility is in a township with a higher concentration of tourism and/or agribusiness
- The facility's catchment zone includes rural or regional communities, for example, through hosting of competition teams that are from rural or regional towns.

Any applications seeking consideration on basis of rurality **must** speak to their SRV representative prior to submitting an application.

2.3. Eligible applications

Only eligible applications will be assessed and considered for funding by SRV.

To be eligible for funding, applications must:

- ensure the project scope and funding request adhere to the funding requirements
- be able to demonstrate that the infrastructure project will be completed within 24 months of execution of a Grant Agreement with the DJSIR (for successful projects)
- exclude activities listed in Section 7
- be submitted (including all supporting documentation) by 5:00 pm on Thursday 26 February 2026
- Each individual infrastructure project requires a separate application. Bundled projects will be deemed ineligible.

Stages of a larger facility development may seek support from the Program, providing the stage addresses the assessment criteria and meets all other eligibility requirements. For a staged project, please provide information on the delivery of any future stages, including timelines.

3.3. Funding ratios

Funding ratios apply to the Program and as outlined in the table below.

Applicants must confirm matched funding consistent with the funding ratios. Ratios are calculated using total project cost (exclusive of GST).

Applications may include project management fees of up to 7.5% of the total project cost (exclusive of GST).

Applications must include contingency that is a minimum 10% of the total project cost (exclusive of GST).

Applicants cannot use other State Government funding, such as funding from Regional Development Victoria, as part of their local contribution throughout the delivery of the project.

Local contributions may comprise of funding from other organisations including LGAs, sport and recreation clubs, state sporting associations, schools, educational institutions, Federal Government, community organisations or in-kind support (limits apply to in-kind support).

3.4. In-kind contributions

An in-kind contribution is a contribution of goods or services other than money. Applications for infrastructure projects can claim in-kind expenses up to a maximum of 50% of the local contribution.

LGAs must approve and underwrite any in-kind contribution from third parties for each applicable application. Examples include voluntary labour, donated goods and donated services.

Applications that include in-kind contributions must provide:

- a completed <u>in-kind and voluntary support form</u>
- a letter from the LGA Chief Executive Officer that approves and underwrites any in-kind contributions.

3.5. Fair Access **Policy Roadmap**

All Victorian LGAs must continue to have an acceptable gender equitable access and use policy (or equivalent) in place to be considered eligible to receive community sport infrastructure funding, reflecting the Victorian Government's Fair Access Policy Roadmap (the Roadmap). The Roadmap aims to develop a statewide foundation to improve the access to, and use of, community sports infrastructure for women and girls.

Policies should ensure that women and girls can fully participate in and enjoy the benefits of community sport, with fair opportunity and access to their local community sport facilities.

3.6. Facilities on school land

LGAs are eligible to apply to the Program for projects located on school land.

For projects on school land, applicants must provide a Community Joint Use Proposal, which is completed by the applicant and the school and a letter from the Department of Education central office that endorses the project.

Projects on non-government school land are also eligible for funding and require a similar demonstration of commitment from both parties to ensure long-term community access is achieved under agreed terms.

3.7. Facilities on Crown land

LGAs are eligible to apply to the Program for projects located on Crown land. Partnerships between LGAs, committees of management and other land managers for projects that support community sport and active recreation outcomes on Crown land are encouraged.

Types of projects that will not be funded

- Applications from LGAs that do not have an acceptable gender equitable access and use policy (or equivalent) in place
- Facilities where little or no public access is available
- The purchase of land (in general, the land on which the facility development is proposed will be municipal property, a Crown reserve, land owned by a public authority, private land with public access rights or land held for public purposes by trustees)
- Requests for retrospective funding, where projects have commenced construction or are completed prior to the execution of a grant agreement (construction includes, but is not limited to demolition, site clearing, earthworks, building works and any form of early works)
- Buildings or equipment considered temporary or not permanent in nature or intended use
- Metal halide lighting (only LED lighting systems will be funded)
- Upgrading or redeveloping kitchens or public toilet facilities, except as part of a larger project that meets the objectives of the Program
- Requests for ongoing operational costs such as, but not limited to, salaries, electricity, water, asset maintenance and other utilities
- Routine or cyclical maintenance works

- Purchasing or maintaining recreation, entertainment, sporting, lifesaving or any other equipment (except as part of facility fit out)
- Projects previously funded by SRV unless applicants can demonstrate additional or new uses resulting in increased participation/programming outcomes
- Projects that do not meet relevant sport or Australian Standards (for example, lighting projects). Facilities that do not comply with the relevant sport standard must seek exemption from the relevant sporting organisation and supply appropriate evidence to be supported by the Program
- The replacement of like-for-like surfaces (for example, synthetic surface replaced by a similar synthetic surface) are ineligible for funding. To be eligible for funding the application will need to demonstrate that additional uses are proposed and/or a multi-purpose element is being introduced. Exceptional circumstances may be considered where significant safety or compliance issues are evident, and an activity will not continue to be conducted as a result. Applicants will need to provide a condition audit or other technical evidence demonstrating the safety or compliance issue

- · Repair of facilities damaged by vandalism, fire or other natural disasters where the damage can be fully covered by insurance. The Program may consider supporting applications where the scope includes elements that are not covered by insurance, or for amounts exceeding the value insured
- In general, areas designated as licenced areas within a proposed facility will not be eligible for funding. DJSIR may consider applications where a restricted club licence is proposed or in place, provided that the restricted licence does not interfere with the facility's other amenities or services, such as childcare or access by young people
- Projects where contributions from funding partners are not confirmed in writing and by bank statement/s or underwritten by the applicant
- Tenant clubs that have failed to resolve a breach of the Fair Play Code
- Applications for bundled projects where the one single application proposes to deliver multiple projects that will occur at different sites
- Applications where the project beneficiary receives revenue directly from Electronic Gaming Machines will not be prioritised
- Scoreboards, behind goal netting, coaches' boxes and other supporting infrastructure unless considered a minor component of a larger project.



Assessment process

A Program Steering Committee has been formed to oversee this Program including the assessment of applications. The committee comprises representatives from SRV, AFL, AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria.

Only eligible applications will be assessed and considered for funding by the department. An application must address all assessment criteria as per Section 4. Claims made against each criterion must be substantiated with evidence.

SRV reserves the right to not assess an application should insufficient information be provided, including responses to assessment criteria and mandatory supporting documentation.

SRV reserves the right to negotiate a lower than requested funding amount for submitted applications.

Applications will be considered against the assessment criteria by SRV staff and then reviewed by a Moderation Panel. The Moderation Panel will also consider the Investment Priorities outlined at Section 1.4 and in each stream before making recommendations to the Minister.

SRV will also consider an applicant's past performance and the organisation's capacity to deliver projects on time. Compliance with past Grant Agreements and the number and duration of overdue milestones (including outcomes reports) for existing projects will also be considered, along with live projects with significant budget shortfalls.

Decisions regarding funding by the Minister for Community Sport are final and no further correspondence shall be entered into regarding such decisions.

LGAs are invited to seek feedback from SRV on unsuccessful applications.



Conditions that apply to funding

9.1. Grant agreements

Successful applicants must enter a Grant Agreement with DJSIR with initial project payments made in the 2026-27 financial year.

The Grant Agreement will include reference to the following:

- recipients are responsible for all Project cost overruns
- recipients must apply the Grant and any interest derived by the recipient from Grant monies solely for the purposes of the Project
- the facility tenant club/s are expected to adhere to the Fair Play Code or related state sporting association Code of Conduct. More information can be found at Fair Play Code
- recipients may seek timing and/or scope variations for funded projects. Consideration of variations may lead to changes in deliverables, milestones, grant amount and payments
- LGAs must inform the participating organisation/s, where applicable, of all funding arrangements and obligations in relation to the grant allocation. This includes ensuring the funded project does not start prior to the execution of the Grant Agreement
- acknowledgement and Ministerial event requirements.

An LGA officer must be designated to manage the project and provide information to DJSIR according to the following key reporting requirements:

- a Project Management Framework must be completed and submitted for all applications
- LGAs must secure SRV's endorsement of key documents such as schematic plans and architectural/planning briefs prior to works commencing. Projects must not start or be tendered until endorsement is provided.
 SRV may not make milestone payments if endorsement is not secured in a timely manner
- LGAs must provide project acquittal documentation as required
- LGAs are expected to guarantee the cash flow payments towards works where a community organisation is providing funding contributions for a project
- LGAs must contribute information on activity outcomes for use in outcomes reporting, program evaluation reviews or DJSIR publications, 12 months after project acquittal.

9.2. Acknowledging the Victorian Government's support and promoting success

Successful applicants need to acknowledge the Victorian Government, AFL, AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria's support through the provision of a grant from the Program. Promotional guidelines form part of the grant agreement and include the requirement that all activities acknowledge Victorian Government, AFL, AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria's support through logo presentation on any activity-related publications, media releases and promotional material; and/or placing a Victorian Government endorsed sign at the site of infrastructure activities.

Details of requirements for funded projects are available in the <u>SRV: Infrastructure Grants Acknowledgement and Publicity Guidelines</u>.

Successful applicants may be required to contribute information on activity outcomes for use in program evaluation reviews or the department's marketing materials.

9.3. Payments

Payments will be made conditional upon:

- the Grant Agreement having been signed by both parties
- milestones having been achieved to DJSIR's satisfaction including provision of required/ requested information and reports to the satisfaction of DJSIR
- other terms and conditions of funding continue to be met.

A minimum of 5% of the grant will be paid upon financial acquittal of the project.

Payments advanced prior to completion are subject to refund if the Project is not performed in accordance with the Grant Agreement.

9.4. Privacy

DJSIR is committed to protecting the privacy of applicants. Any personal information provided through the application will be collected for the purposes of administering the grant application and informing the public of successful applications.

To be able to administer grant applications effectively and efficiently, DJSIR may need to disclose applicants' personal information to State and Commonwealth Government departments and external experts, such as members of assessment panels, for the purposes of assessment, consultation, and reporting. If there is an intention to include personal information about third parties in the application, applicants should ensure they are aware of, and consent to the contents of this privacy statement.

Any personal information about applicants or third parties will be collected, held, managed, used, disclosed or transferred in accordance with the provisions of the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic) and other applicable laws.

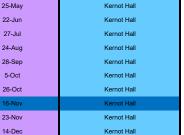

REQUEST FOR COMMEMORATIVE STATUE ON COUNCIL LAND

PURPOSE

To seek Council endorsement on the location of a commemorative statue within Council owned land for those impacted by asbestos related diseases.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Gippsland Asbestos Related Disease Support (GARDS) have recently approached Council seeking support to install a commemorative statue on Council owned land, namely the Moe Botanic Gardens, for those impacted by asbestos related diseases.
- Gippsland residents have been affected by asbestos related illnesses more than any other area in Victoria.
- GARDS have commenced fund raising and previously made a submission to the 2024/2025 Council Budget process seeking the funding required to construct the statue.
- The proposed statue does not align with any existing Council Policy (I.e. Plaques and Memorials Policy), consequently there is no clear guidance to inform a decision by Council however it is recognised that asbestos related diseases have impacted a significant number of individuals and families within Latrobe City.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. endorses the location for a commemorative statue for those impacted by asbestos related diseases within the Moe Botanic Gardens on Council owned land:
- 2. notes that officers will work with Gippsland Asbestos Related Disease Support to determine the most appropriate location for the installation of the statue at the Moe Botanic Gardens; and
- 3. refers the potential funding of the statue to the 26/27 financial year Council budget process for consideration.

BACKGROUND

GARDS previously approached Council seeking support and funding to construct a commemorative statue on Council owned land.

GARDS have recently approached Council again wishing to formalise the preferred site, and to again seek funds for the statue.

A concept of what the statue could look like is provided at **Attachment 1**.

ANALYSIS

Officers have reviewed the request against Council's Plaques and Memorials Policy and consider the request to be not suitable for assessment under this policy given its unique nature.

This policy specifically relates to plaques and memorials for individuals, members of the Latrobe City community who made a substantial contribution to the community and that have a clear association with the place the plaque or memorial is located.

Officers understand that asbestos related diseases have impacted a significant number of individuals and families within Latrobe City and that the community may respond well to a statue of this nature.

Officers are of the opinion that Council should not directly fund this statue as it would set a precedent for this type of enquiry. It should be noted that the GARDS are eligible for Council's Community Grants program.

Asbestos and the Latrobe Valley

We used to climb over that [asbestos lagging], it was just like fluff and it used to blow up into the air and we used to throw it at each other and play in it and have a good old time. That was just normal.

Former power station employee

Thousands of people have died of asbestos-related illnesses in the Latrobe Valley since the power industry began.

Although the adverse health effects of asbestos were noted as early as 1899 and the lethality of asbestos recognised by governments in Britain and the United States, the dangers of asbestos only became widely-known in Australia in the 1970s.

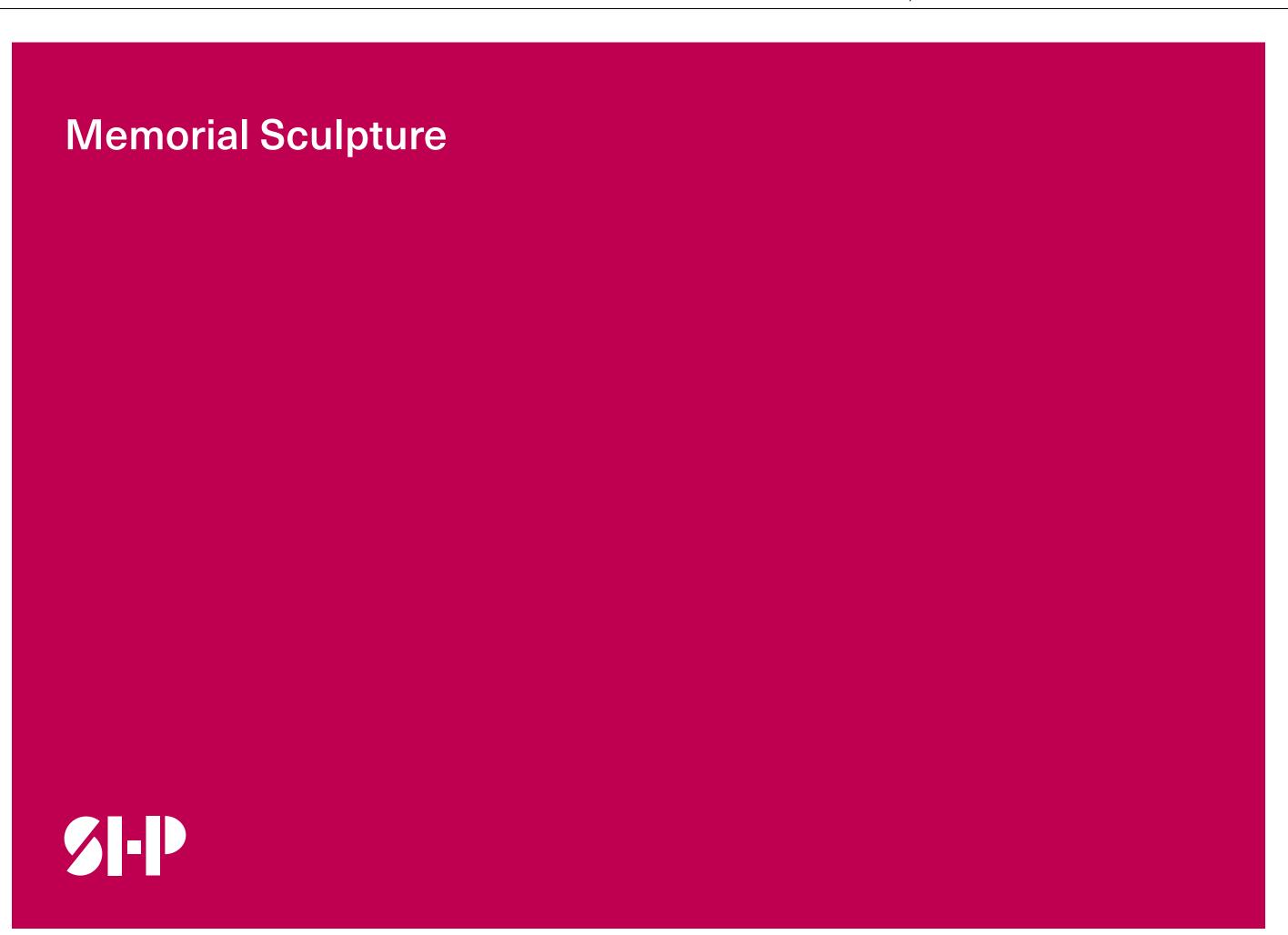
In the 1940s and 1950s, the SEC was informed of the dangers of exposure to asbestos dust in its power stations but the information was widely disregarded by the authorities.

A former SEC employee at Yallourn power station noted that in the 1960s 'you could walk into "A" station and you couldn't see the other end of the boilers.'

Victoria banned the use of asbestos in 2003, but the use of asbestos in the power stations of the Latrobe Valley has contributed to the development of asbestos-related disease in thousands of people. Asbestos-related illnesses have affected not only workers' families but also the whole community.

ACV/GARDS Memorial Sculpture

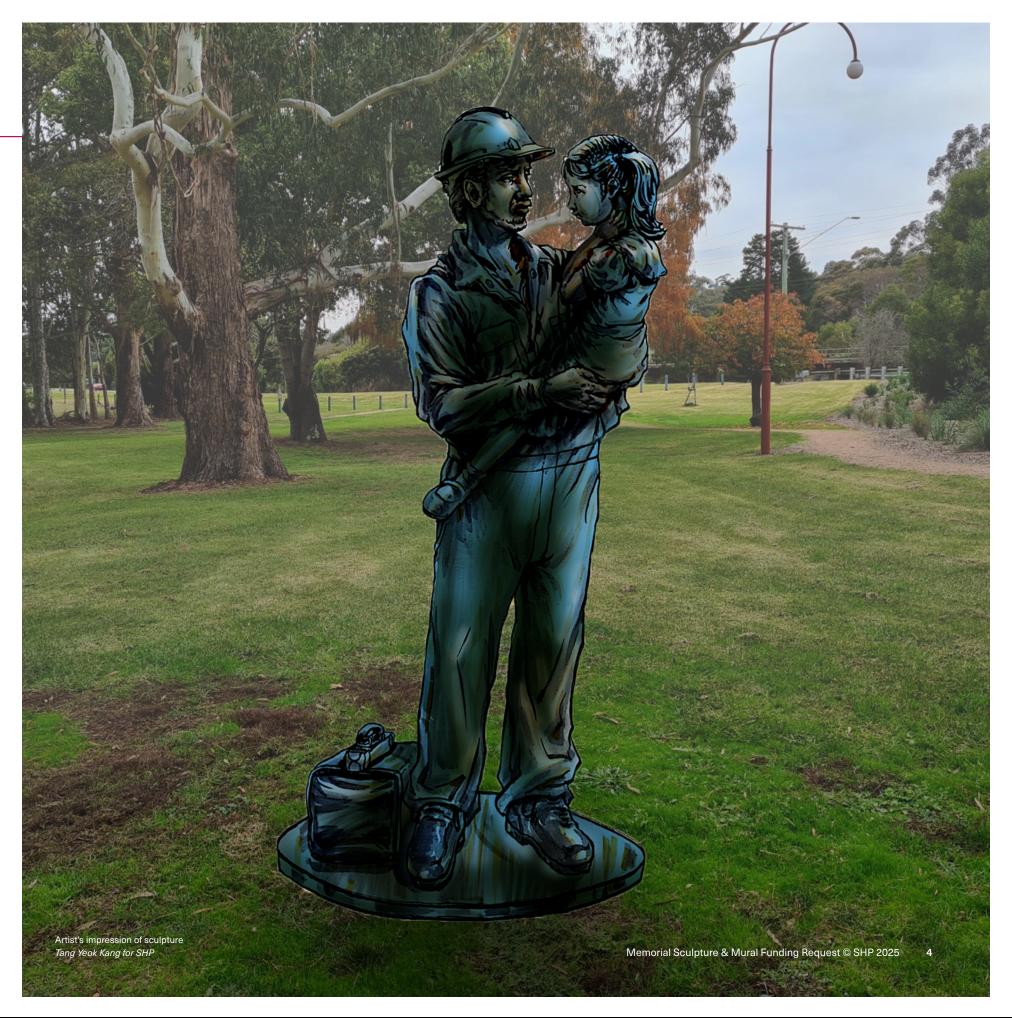
This sculpture is designed as a memorial to the people who lost their lives to asbestos-related diseases contracted at power stations in the Latrobe Valley. The sculpture depicts a power worker with his young daughter to recognise that asbestos-related diseases did not, and do not, just impact workers but their whole families too.

The sculpture uses a contemporary art approach to revitalise narratives of the power stations in a way that is both respectful and historically accurate. Design work has been driven by historical research into clothing and objects from the 1960s era, with styles carefully chosen by ACV/ GARDS to reflect the 1920s-80s to ensure the sculpture is relatable to all impacted families.

The man and child have a familiar, unimposing stance.

They will be produced at 1:1.15 scale to evoke a sense of connection to and empathy with the lived and personal experiences of those impacted by asbestos-related diseases.

ACV/GARDS have wanted to commemorate the thousands of people who died across the Latrobe Valley through a memorial for over 25 years. Proposed to be located in the Moe Botanical Gardens, this sculpture will provide a dedicated and accessible place for community reflection and remembrance at long last.



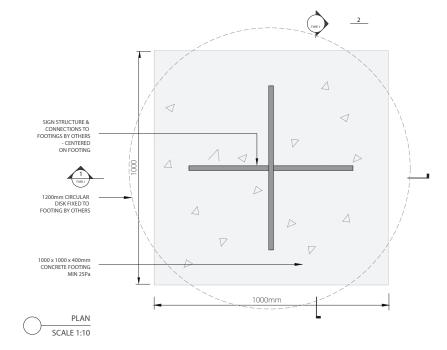


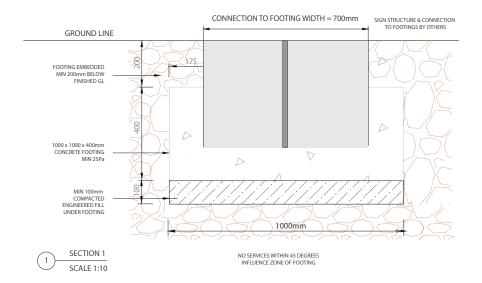

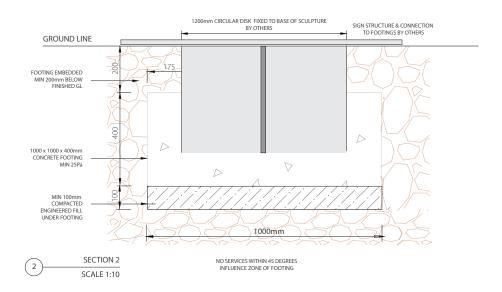

She has also created three-dimensional artwork for architects, designers, other artists, museums and zoos, and the display, theatre and film industries. This has enabled her to become proficient in a wide range of traditional and contemporary materials and techniques and learn to work efficiently to set budgets and deadlines.

For the past decade, Lis has focused on figurative bronze portrait sculpture ('statues'), and is pleased to be part of the movement to create more statues of women. 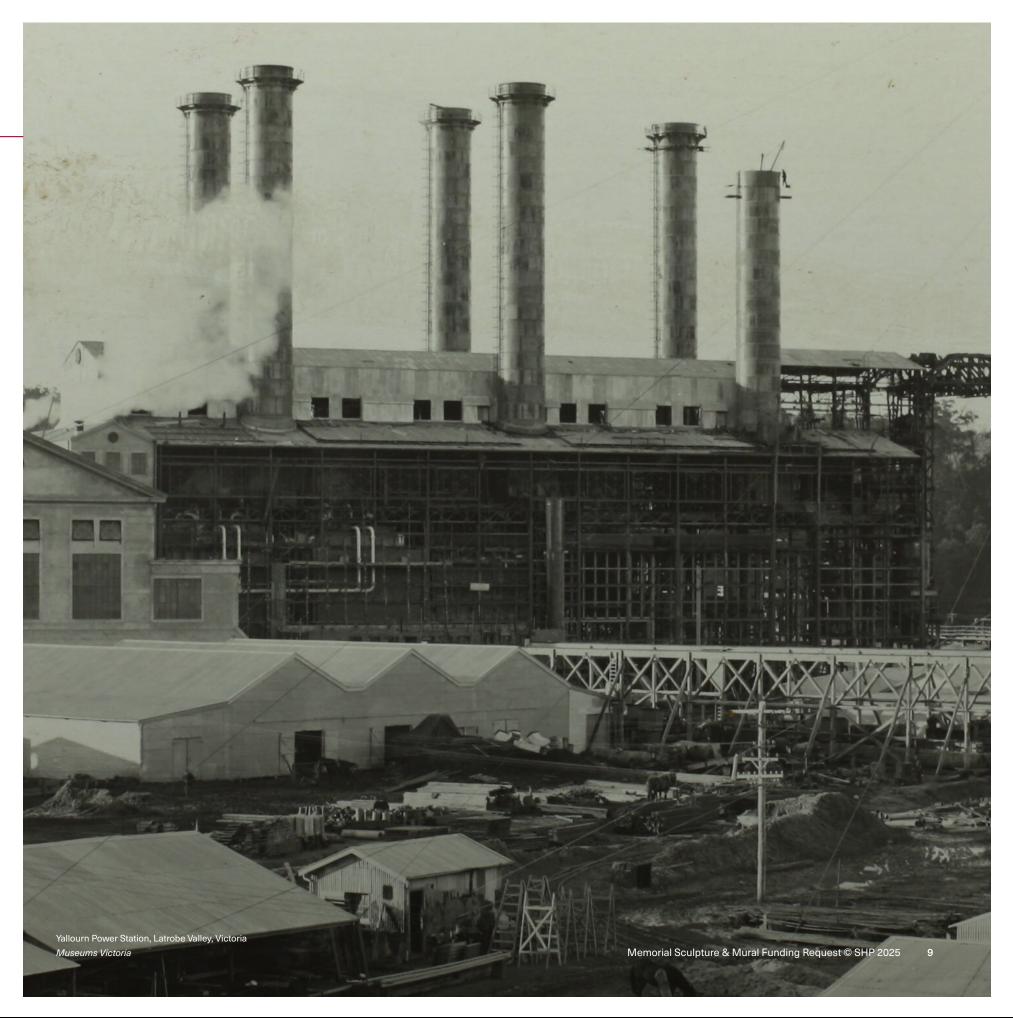

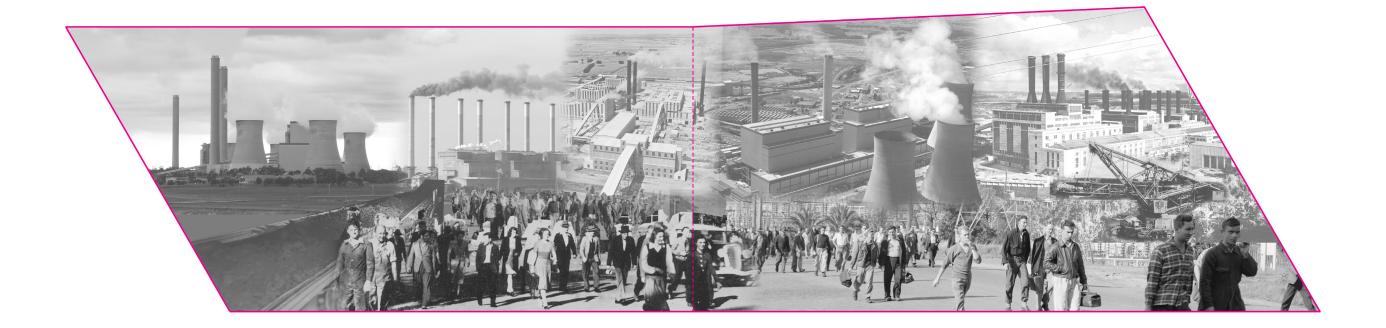

A mural based on the photomontage below will be painted on the wall of the toilet block at the Moe Botanical Gardens. The Mural will be designed to complement the memorial sculpture and accompanied by an interpretive panel. It depicts workers leaving their workplaces against a background of the five current and former power stations in the Latrobe Valley: Loy Yang A and Loy Yang B, Morwell, Yallourn and Hazelwood. The stories of these workers remain largely untold, but many became ill or died as a result of asbestos-related diseases.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

PURPOSE

To present recommendations for the future management of Council's international relations activities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Council has an International Engagement and Investment Committee.
 Historically, the Committee had representation from Councillors and interested community members. They met monthly. Key topics were inbound and outbound delegations.
- The operation and support for the Committee has been provided by Council Staff. This necessitated several hours per month of staff time to organise and conduct meetings. Officer time was also required to implement any actions arising from the meeting. If the Committee is reactivated, an allocation of officer time would be required. There was also some crossover with other Council staff in relation to inbound business delegations
- The committee ceased meeting during Covid. Whilst in the Covid lockdown, the International Investment and Engagement Officer left Council to take a role in the State Government and all correspondence with the Sister Cities ceased.
- Whilst still listed as a Council Committee, The International Engagement and Investment Committee has not been reactivated.
- A proposal has been received from an external group of interested parties who
 would like to establish the 'Latrobe City International Friendship Association'.
 The proposed membership of this group would include past participants in
 Council's international relations programs with the Sister Cities. They would like
 to be responsible for the cultural activities with the Sister Cities, e.g. inbound
 and outbound cultural delegations. A copy of the proposal is attached
 (Attachment 1)
- A key role of the Committee and Council Officers has been the coordination of inbound and outbound cultural delegations. The recent delegation visit by Takasago provides some insight as to cost and time. The cost to Council for the four-day visit in August was \$8,300. Officer time was estimated at FTE 34 days (Band 6 Officer). In addition, there were several events attended by Councillors, CEO and General Manager.

- In addition, the Committee helped organise the Sister City Festivals, which were held every two years. These festivals celebrated the relationships with our Sister Cities (Taizhou in China and Takasago in Japan) and were held in different towns across the municipality. The last festival was held in Moe in November 2018, attracting 3,000 visitors.
- There has also been renewed interest in conducting an expanded Sister City
 Festival in Latrobe City. The concept would be to conduct a festival in each of
 the key towns in Latrobe City.
- The Events Team put together an indicative budget estimated for a single location would be approximately \$80,000 not including Officer time.
- It would be anticipated that to hold three separate festivals there would be some
 economies of scale however, would require in the region of \$180,000 (Council
 contribution) to deliver and a commitment to 12 months of planning for Officers
 which would reduce the resources to be able to focus on other events in the
 region.
- Council officers recommend that:
 - The International Engagement and Investment Committee be disbanded and the economic development activities be incorporated into the Economic Development Advisory Committees activities.
 - A working group be established with the proposed Latrobe City International Friendship Association to develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and draft Terms of Reference (ToR). The MOU and ToR would set out the proposed role of the Association, notably the conduct of cultural activities with Sister Cities on behalf of Council. These activities could include cultural exchanges and Sister City festivals. A further report would be prepared for consideration by Councillors when the MOU and ToR have been drafted.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. disbands the International Engagement and Investment Committee and refer any international relations economic development activities to the Economic Development Advisory Committee;
- 2. supports the establishment of a working group with the proposed Latrobe City International Friendship Association to develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and draft Terms of Reference (ToR); and
- 3. Requests a further report with the proposed MOU and ToR for consideration by Councillors.

BACKGROUND

Latrobe City Council has two Sister City Agreements: Takasago in Japan and Taizhou in China. Both Sister City Agreements were signed in 2000. A re-affirmation of our relationship was signed with Takasago in 2023.

International Engagement and Investment Committee

To support the Sister Cities and other international activities, Council established an International Relations Committee. The Committee consisted of Councillors and community members. The Committee had oversight of all international activities and was supported by an International Relations Officer.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting in August 2019, Council adopted the *International Engagement and Investment Strategy*. This strategy set out the objectives of the Committee and changed the name of the Committee to the International Engagement and Investment Committee. The adopted roles are set out in the following image:



The Committee met monthly.

In March 2020, Covid restrictions were instigated and the Committee ceased to meet. Committee members agreed to hold over future meetings until the Covid restrictions were eased.

In the Covid lockdown period, the International Engagement and Investment Officer accepted a position with the State Government. This created an issue for Council as communication became difficult due to language barriers. The Officer also had personal relationships that had helped Council.

In addition, the Federal Government introduced *Foreign Arrangements* legislation which required Council to detail its relationship with China and register any interests.

After restrictions were eased, there was limited correspondence with Takasago and no correspondence with Taizhou.

The committee has not reconvened post Covid restrictions. The terms of appointment for all the Community members have expired.

In July this year, a proposal was received from a group of local residents who would like to take responsibility for the cultural activities for our Sister Cities. This group have all been involved with previous Sister City activities, such as inbound and outbound cultural exchanges, homestays and the Assisted Language Teacher program. They propose establishing the 'Latrobe City International Friendship Association'

The proposal sets out a model (based on the Hobson Bay International Friendship Association) that would have the group take responsibility for the cultural activities and Council maintain the trade and investment activities.

Sister City Festivals

Following a recent visit by a delegation from Takasago, there has been renewed interest in organising and conducting a Sister City Festival. The interest extends to having festivals in Moe, Morwell and Traralgon.

Sister City Festivals have previously been organised by the International Engagement and Investment Committee, in conjunction with Council teams, such as events and economic development. Initially, the festivals were held annually but shifted to bi-annual in the early 2000's.

The last festival was held in the Moe Botanical Gardens in November 2018. A delegation came from Takasago for the event and representatives from the Chinese and Japanese embassies attended the festival. The events team estimated attendance to be circa 3,000 people.

ANALYSIS

International Engagement and Investment Committee

As a Council Committee, the internal responsibility for the Committee resides with the Economic Investment and Transition Team. If the committee was to be reconvened, an expression of interest process would need to be undertaken to appoint new community members. The current Terms of Reference provide for four Councillors and up to nine community representatives. A copy of the Terms of Reference is attached (Attachment 2).

Whilst not prescriptive, previous committee members included representatives from Federation University, TAFE Gippsland, secondary colleges and interested community members.

Consideration would be needed to determine the number of meetings held annually. The operation and support for the Committee has been provided by Council Staff. This necessitated several hours per month of staff time to organise and conduct meetings. Officer time was also required to implement any actions arising from the meeting. If the Committee is reactivated, an allocation of officer time would be required.

A key role of the Committee and Council Officers has been the coordination of inbound and outbound cultural delegations. The recent delegation visit by Takasago provides some insight as to cost and time. The cost to Council for the four-day visit in August was \$8,300. Officer time was estimated at FTE 34 days (Band 6 Officer) as detailed in **Attachment 3**. In addition, there were several events attended by Councillors, CEO and General Manager.

If consideration is given to the proposal by the proposed 'Latrobe City International Friendship Association', an agreement would need to be negotiated to set out proposed activities, expected outcomes and potential funding support from Council.

In terms of Council's work to foster international investment, Officers regularly engage with Invest Victoria (IV) which is the Victorian State Government international investment department. IV have 22 offices across the globe to represent Victoria's international interest with the aim of attracting investment to Victoria. Officers meet with IV to provide information and opportunities as it relates to Latrobe City.

Sister City Festivals

As detailed above, there is renewed interest in organising and conducting a Sister City festival. There is also interest in potentially holding three festivals – one each in Moe, Morwell and Traralgon.

To provide some guidance, a proposal was drafted to hold a festival in 2025 in one location. The Event Team put together some ideas and an indicative budget. They estimated the budget for a single location would be approximately \$80,000 - \$60,000 from Council and \$20,000 from external sponsors. The proposal did not include an estimation of Officer time, however, the festival held in 2018 necessitated 12 months of planning and organisation. It would be anticipated that to hold three separate festivals there would be some economies of scale however, would require in the region of \$180,000 (Council contribution) to deliver and a commitment to 12 months of planning for Officers which would reduce the resources to be able to focus on other events in the region.

It should be noted that the Council Plan does not include a focus on International relations, however, Officers certainly recognise the benefits of cultural exchanges, in particular for students, by providing the opportunity to experience new cultures and the potential to travel overseas and the community benefits of delivering community events focused on Council's Sister Cities.

Options

Councillors have several options in relation to:

International Engagement and Investment:

Reconvene the International Engagement and Investment Committee. Conduct an expression of interest process to appoint new members. Develop a new business plan. Consider the budgetary requirements for activities e.g. cultural delegations.

Option 2

Negotiate an agreement with the 'Latrobe City International Friendship Association' to conduct the cultural activities with the Sister Cities on behalf of Council. Negotiations could include the proposed activities, expected outcomes and milestones. Budgetary considerations would be required as the Association would expect funding support from Council.

Option 3

A hybrid arrangement between Options 1 & 2

Sister Cities Festival

Option 1

Organise and conduct the Sister City Festival supported and funded by Council. This would require budget to be allocated in the region of \$150,000 plus Officers time.

Option 2

Outsource the organisation and delivery of the Sister City festival to a group, such as the 'Latrobe City International Friendship Association'. There would be a cost to Council for this organisation's services in addition to the festival costs

Option 3

Do not proceed with a Sister City Festival

It is Officers view is that there is merit in entering into a relationship with 'Latrobe City International Friendship Association' to outsource agreed international activities namely cultural exchanges, and an international festival.

It should be noted that the Council Plan does not include a focus on International relations, however, Officers certainly recognise the benefits of cultural exchanges, in particular for students, by providing the opportunity to experience new cultures and the potential to travel overseas and the community benefits of delivering community events focused on Council's Sister Cities.

Latrobe City International Sister Cities Friendship Association - Proposal

Thank you for making time available, along with your CEO and Officers, to meet with our delegation on Tuesday 1st July last.

Following these discussions, this letter is provided to confirm with you our interest in establishing a "Latrobe City International Sister Cities Friendship Association" for the purpose of creating a framework for past participants in Latrobe City Council's International Sister Cities Program of activities over the years, involving both the City of Takasago in Japan and the City of Taizhou in China to remain "community connected" into the future.

Understanding that Council has limited available resources, it is anticipated that the role of this Association would focus on people exchanges/festivals etc, and could play a support role, if and when required by Council, regarding international economic activities and relationships being undertaken by the Council.

The proposed Association would be modelled along similar lines to that which exist with Hobson Bay International Friendship Association, which is supported by Hobson Bay City Council. See their website: www.hbifa.org.au

An extract from their website follows:

"THE HOBSONS BAY INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP ASSOCIATION

The Hobsons Bay International Friendship Association is made up of local families who donate their time, effort and enthusiasm to ensure the continued success of the Sister City Agreement between Hobsons Bay and Anjo.

The Association, with the support of Hobsons Bay City Council, actively promotes the Sister City Relationship and is responsible for the organisation of many exciting events and activities.

One of the main functions of the Association is to facilitate an annual Student Exchange Program which provides the opportunity for students in Hobsons Bay to experience at first hand, the culture and lifestyle of countries other than Australia.

Latrobe City International Sister Cities Friendship Association - Proposal (Cont.)

The Association also conducts a Cultural Exchange Program where a piece of art is donated to Anjo from various artists within Hobsons Bay and likewise from Anjo every three years.

A Japanese citizen delegation also visits Hobsons Bay every three years where members of the Association offer homestay accommodation.

The Association has hosted more than 500 participants in its 30 year history comprising students, Chaperones and the citizen delegations.

The Association also holds a Japanese writing competition for Hobsons Bay secondary students each year with prize money awarded to the best entries".

It is anticipated that the proposed Latrobe City International Sister Cities Friendship Association would become an Incorporated Association, and would function in a similar way to Hobson Bay Friendship Association, as outlined above.

Our research has identified that the Constitution of the Australian Sister Cities Association could be appropriate and adapted to meet the needs of the proposed Association.

In order for this proposal to establish a Latrobe City International Sister Cities Friendship Association to be suitably "worked out" and progress, it is considered highly desirable that Council would provide favourable support for this community initiative.

As a result, we trust that Council will give due consideration to our proposal, and we look forward to, hopefully, receiving a positive response, and having further discussions in due course.

1. Establishment of the Committee

- 1.1. The Latrobe City International Relations Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee"), is a formally appointed Advisory Committee of Latrobe City Council established for the purposes of providing advice to Council.
- 1.2. The membership of this Committee and these Terms of Reference will be adopted by resolution of Latrobe City Council at a Council Meeting.

2. Objectives

- 2.1. The Committee's role is to report to the Council and provide appropriate advice, information and feedback on matters relevant to this Terms of Reference in order to facilitate decision making by the Council in relation to the discharge of its responsibilities.
- 2.2. The Committee is an advisory committee only and has no delegated decision making authority.
- 2.3. The Committee is established to:
 - 2.3.1. provide advice to Council on matters related to all aspects of International Relations, specifically to promote economic, tourism and cultural development;
 - 2.3.2. support Councils initiatives in respect to International Relations across the community of Latrobe City; and
 - 2.3.3. liaise where relevant with other Council committees on internal aspects of international relations
- 2.4. The Committee will carry out the following in order to achieve the objectives set:
 - 2.4.1. To provide advice and assistance with the development of a range of economic, cultural, sporting, educational, youth and exchange opportunities;
 - 2.4.2. To promote, through sister city and other international relationships, greater understanding between the communities of Latrobe City and the participating cities and, in doing so, contribute to the mutual welfare of all the communities involved:
 - 2.4.3. To advise Council of new international relationship opportunities;
 - 2.4.4. Increase community awareness and participation in the various aspects of the Australian Sister Cities networks;



- 2.4.5. In support of the Council, act as an advocate and channel of communication for the community and other stakeholders to enhance international relationships;
- 2.4.6. To engage with multicultural communities within Latrobe City to foster knowledge, understanding and co-operation;
- 2.4.7. Policy and Strategy Development
 - 2.4.7.1. Provide advice as part of a policy, strategy (or other relevant document) review or development processes as required from time to time.
- 2.4.8. Perform other activities related to this Terms of Reference as requested by the Council.

3. Membership

Composition of the Committee

- 3.1. The Committee shall comprise of 21 members, being:
 - 3.1.1. Up to three Councillors;
 - 3.1.2. Up to nine of Community representatives appointed via expression of interest process;
 - 3.1.3. 1 representative of the Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation (GLaWAC) where GLaWAC chooses to nominate a representative; and
 - 3.1.4. Latrobe City Council Officers:
 - 3.1.4.1. Manager Economic Investment and Attraction;
 - 3.1.4.2. Coordinator Business Development

Length of appointment

- 3.2. The Committee shall be in place for as long as Latrobe City Council sees fit, and the appointment of members shall be for a term as deemed appropriate by Council.
- 3.3. Prior to the expiration of each term, there will be a call for nominations for the next term. Current Committee members are able to re-nominate.

Selection of members and filling of vacancies

3.4. Latrobe City Council shall determine the original membership of a Committee based on expressions of interest received from members of the community and nominations received from organisations.



3.5. The Committee may fill any vacancies that occur within the determined period of appointment, subject to the approval of the General Manager of the relevant division and endorsement of Council. Where a vacancy is filled in this way, the appointment shall be limited to the remainder of the period of the original appointment.

Co-option of members

3.6. With the approval of the Chair, the Committee may invite other individuals to participate in the proceedings of the Committee on a regular or an occasional basis and including in the proceedings of any sub-committees formed.

Attendance at meetings

- 3.7. All Committee members are expected to attend each meeting.
- 3.8. A member who misses two consecutive meetings without a formal apology may at the discretion of Latrobe City Council have their term of office revoked.
- 3.9. A member who is unable to attend the majority of meetings during the year may at the discretion of Latrobe City Council have their term of office revoked.

Resignations

3.10. All resignations from members of the Committee are to be submitted in writing to the General Manager of the relevant division, Latrobe City Council, PO Box 264, Morwell VIC 3840.

4. Proceedings

Chair

- 4.1. The nominated Councillor shall Chair the meetings.
- 4.2. If the Councillor delegate is unavailable he/she shall delegate to the other nominated Councillor to chair the meeting.
- 4.3. If neither Councillor is available, the Chair may nominate a replacement from the current membership of the Committee to chair the meeting.

Meeting schedule

- 4.4. The Committee will determine its meeting schedule and times for each of the meetings. The duration of each Committee meeting should generally not exceed two hours.
- 4.5. Meetings of the Committee will be held monthly initially or as may be deemed necessary by Latrobe City Council or the Committee to fulfil the objectives of the Committee. Special meetings may be held on an as-needs basis.



Meeting procedures

- 4.6. Meetings will follow standard meeting procedures as established in any guidance material and outlined in these terms of reference for Advisory Committees provided (see appendix one for the agenda template).
- 4.7. Members are expected to comply with the confidential information provisions contained in the *Local Government Act 2020* and must treat information they receive as confidential unless otherwise advised. Members must not use confidential information other than for the purpose of performing their function as a member of the Committee.
- 4.8. If a member has a general or material conflict of interest as defined in the Local Government Act 2020 regarding an item to be considered or discussed by the Committee, the member must disclose this to the Chair if they are attending the meeting.
 - 4.8.1 Once a declaration of either general or material conflict of interest has been made, the member must leave the room and remain outside until the conclusion of the relevant discussion. The time of leaving the meeting room and the time of their return must be recorded in the minutes or notes of the meeting.
- 4.9. All recommendations, proposals and advice must be directed through the Chair.

Quorum

- 4.10. A majority of the members constitutes a quorum.
- 4.11. If at any Committee meeting a quorum is not present within 30 minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall be deemed adjourned.

Voting

4.12. There will be no official voting process, although all members shall have equal voting rights. Majority and minority opinions will be reflected in Committee minutes.

Minutes of the Meeting

- 4.13. A Latrobe City Officer or authorised agent shall take the minutes of each Committee meeting.
- 4.14. The minutes shall be in a standard format including a record of those present, apologies for absence, adoption of previous minutes and a list of adopted actions and resolutions of the Committee (see appendix two for the minutes template).



- 4.15. The minutes shall be stored in the Latrobe City Council corporate filing system (currently Ci Anywhere electronic document and records management system).
- 4.16. The agenda shall be distributed at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting to all Committee members, including alternative representatives.
- 4.17. A copy of the minutes shall be distributed to all Committee members (including alternative representatives) within 10 working days of the meeting.

Reports to Council

- 4.18. With the approval of the Chair, a report to Council may be tabled on the Committee's progress towards the objectives included in this Terms of Reference.
- 4.19. Reports to Council should reflect a consensus of view. Where consensus cannot be reached, the report should clearly outline any differing points of view.
- 4.20. Reports to Council will be co-ordinated through the General Manager of the relevant division that the Committee falls under.

5. Review of Committee and Duration of the Committee

- 5.1. The Committee will cease to exist by resolution of the Council, or once the objectives at item 2.3 are demonstrated to have been met, whichever occurs first.
- 5.2. A review of the Committee will take place at least once every three years at which time the Terms of Reference will also be reviewed.
- 5.3. A review will be conducted on a self-assessment basis (unless otherwise determined by Council) with appropriate input sought from the Council, the CEO, all Committee members, management and any other stakeholders, as determined by Council.
- 5.4. The review must consider:
 - 5.4.1. The Committee's achievements;
 - 5.4.2. Whether there is a demonstrated need for the Committee to continue; and
 - 5.4.3. Any other relevant matter.



6. Authority and Compliance Requirements

- 6.1. The Committee is a consultative committee only and has no executive powers nor does it have any delegated decision making or financial authority.
- 6.2. Failure to comply with the provisions outlined in this Terms of Reference may result in termination of the Member's appointment.

Takasago Delegation – 1 to 5 August

Background

12 representatives from Takasago, including 8 students (12 to 17 years of age) travelled to Morwell from 1 to 5 August 2025, including:

- Mr Tatsuyoshi Tokura, Mayor of Takasago City
- Mr Norifumi Nishinaka, Vice President of TIA
- Mr Kohei Yoshioka, Officer of Culture and Sports Division, Takasago City
- Ms Sawako Kataoka, Takasago International Association

The student program focused on sporting exchanges with community sports groups and leading educational institutions, combining skill development with cultural engagement. A separate program was developed for officials to enable information sharing and provide guidance on priority topics.

The overall program was managed by the Economic Investment and Transition team, in collaboration with the Takasago International Association.

Council staff volunteered as homestay hosts providing accommodation, meals and hospitality. On Sunday, 3 August, they also facilitated local visits to ensure the students experienced the region.

A program budget of \$9,300 was allocated, with the major expense being bus hire at \$4,630.

Objectives

From Council's perspective the visit was an opportunity to:

- 1. Re-affirm commitment to the Sister City program
- Strengthen and identify opportunities for ongoing cultural, educational and sporting relationships
- 3. Promote connections across the Latrobe region, broader than the Council

The ability to secure economic benefits for the region were limited, though potential to promote opportunities for international student placements at Federation University and bespoke sports management course development.

Importantly, Council was able to provide leadership and support for Takasago City as they look to transition to community-based sports management.

QUARTERLY BUDGET REPORT -SEPTEMBER 2025

PURPOSE

To provide Council with the financial results for the first quarter of the 2025/2026 financial year in accordance with the provisions of Section 97(1) of the Local Government Act 2020 (Act).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This report meets the requirements of the Act to present a quarterly budget report to Council as soon as practicable after the end of each quarter of the financial year.
- The report shows that Council overall is operating within the parameters of its adopted budget with most variances relating to carry forward funds from the previous year and the timing of revenue and expenditure within the current financial year.
- The "Income Allocation Statement" currently projects a \$0.7M cash surplus, which is a \$0.2M favourable variance to the adopted budget.
- Council seeks to achieve a balanced budget based on a cash basis and the surplus amounts shown in the Income Allocation Statement are primarily related to increases in government grant funding announced after the adoption of the budget.
- The "Comprehensive Income Statement" report forecasts a Surplus result for the full financial year of \$32.8M, which is an unfavourable variance of \$19.8M to the adopted budget.
- The report is provided for Council's information.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council receives and notes the Budget Report for the Quarter ended 30 September 2025, prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Local Government Act 2020.

BACKGROUND

Under Section 97(1) of the Act, as soon as practicable after the end of each quarter of the financial year, the Chief Executive Officer must ensure that a quarterly budget report is presented to the Council at a Council meeting which is open to the public. This report ensures compliance with this legislative requirement.

ANALYSIS

The attached report, as at 30 September 2025, is provided for the information of Council and the community. The financial report compares budgeted income and expenditure with actual results as at the end of the first quarter of the financial year. The key issues of note are:

- The "Income Allocation Statement" (IAS) currently forecasts a \$0.7M cash surplus, which is \$0.2M favourable to the adopted budget. This variance is mainly as result of additional Victorian Grants Commission Financial Assistance Grants 2025/26 funding (FAGS) \$0.1M and additional savings achieved as part of the Operational Savings Program.
- The IAS shows that the Operational Savings Program that Council included in the 2025/26 Budget to find \$1.5M in savings has been fully achieved with the savings achieved \$64K above this target.
- The "Adjusted Budget Forecast" incorporates funding that has been carried forward from the 2024/25 financial year and changes in government grants funding both in financial year timing and funding amounts
- The "Comprehensive Income Statement" report forecasts a surplus result for the full financial year of \$32.8M, which is an unfavourable variance of \$19.8M to the adopted budget. The variance is mainly resulting from the FAGS funding \$8.4M being advanced to Council in 2024/25 together with additional expenditure relating to carried forward projects from the previous financial year. Details of all variances included in the Comprehensive Income Statement are included in the provided commentary.
- The "Balance Sheet" shows that Council maintains a strong liquidity position with \$238.7M in current assets compared to \$47.2M current liabilities (a liquidity ratio of 5.1:1).
- The budgeted cash & investments at the beginning of the year was \$100.5M, the actual opening balance was \$139.3M. The additional \$38.8M was largely the result of higher than anticipated surplus funds as a result of advanced FAGS funding and capital grants. There has been a relatively low net cash outflow of \$1.5M over the first quarter mainly as a result of the expenditure of funding received in the 2024/25 financial year.
- The "Statement of Capital Works" shows that as at the 30 September 2025
 Council has spent \$11.1M on capital works mostly on Property (buildings)
 projects \$6.1M, Infrastructure projects \$4.0M (including Roads projects \$2.7M)

and Plant & Equipment \$1.0M. Full year forecasted capital expenditure is \$102.5M compared to the budget of \$87.3M. The \$15.2M increase in expenditure is due to funds being carried forward from the previous financial year due to changes in the timing of receipt of grants funds and undertaking of works that was expected when the budget was compiled.

• The "Financial Performance Ratios' indicate that Council remains within the industry expected ranges.

- The "Statement of Cash Flows" shows that Council has \$137.8M in Cash and Financial assets (i.e. investments). The level is higher than anticipated due to carry forward funds from previous financial years including capital works, reserves funds and government grants advanced earlier than expected.
- The "Statement of Capital Works" shows a forecast expenditure of \$102.5M compared to the budget of \$87.3M, largely due to works carried forward from the 2024/25 financial year and additional capital grants income.
- The "Financial Performance Ratios' indicate that Council remains within the industry expected ranges.

The "Income Allocation Statement" (IAS) shows how the annual income is allocated to the various expenditure categories. The statement incorporates the "Adjusted Budget Forecast" which represents the 2025/26 budget adopted by Council on 30 June 2025 adjusted for items carried forward from the 2024/25 financial year and other known changes to government grant funding.

The "Adjusted Budget Forecast" projects a cash surplus of \$0.7M which is \$0.2M favourable to the unallocated cash surplus of \$0.5M that was included in the adopted budget.

COMPREHENSIVE INCOME STATEMENT OVERVIEW

The surplus and deficit amounts shown in the Comprehensive Income Statement year to date and full year budget columns are largely a result of capital grants and non-cash items. Ideally a surplus result would be generated to enable Council to invest in new assets, upgrade and expand existing assets, and repay borrowings. On a cash basis Council budgets for a break even result, with any cash remaining at year end required to meet current and future liabilities together with current commitments. Therefore any variances to budget in the operating result are generally caused by changes in levels of grants and monetary contributions for capital works, and expenditure that is funded from revenue that has been received in a previous financial year together with variances in non-cash items (e.g. loss on disposal of property, infrastructure, plant and equipment).

The "Comprehensive Income Statement" report currently forecasts a surplus result for the full financial year of \$32.8M which is a unfavourable variance of \$19.8M to the original budget. This result is due to a number of variances with a forecasted decrease in income of \$3.1M and additional expenses of \$16.7M. The decreased income is mainly a result of Victorian Grants Commission Financial Assistance Grants 2025/26 funding \$8.4M being advanced to Council in 2024/25 partially offset by increased government operating and capital grants also mainly in relation to financial year timing of receipt and recognition of the funds. The increase expenditure is mainly in relation to funding carried over from previous years and unbudgeted government grant funding to be received in the current year, together with increased annual depreciation expense resulting from increased infrastructure valuations in the 2024/25 financial year.

The unfavourable variance is mainly due to the advance of \$8.4M FAGS funding for 2025/26 being received in the 2024/25 financial year. This has been partially offset by the expected receipt of unbudgeted grants for Sports Legacy & Activation Council Support Package Fund (CSPF) \$1.9M, Natural Disaster Recovery for the August 2024 storm event \$0.5M, Morwell Park Preschool playground \$0.2M and School Readiness program funding \$0.2M.

BALANCE SHEET OVERVIEW

The Balance Sheet shows that Council maintains a strong liquidity position with \$238.7M in current assets compared to \$47.2M current liabilities (a liquidity ratio of 5.1:1).

NOTES TO THE BALANCE SHEET - Year to Date Movement

1. Cash and Cash Equivalents/Other Financial Assets

(\$1.5M) Decrease

The overall decrease is mainly due to expenditure of funds carried over from prior financial years.

2. Trade and Other receivables

\$90.4M Increase

Mainly due to the annual rates notices being raised in the first quarter which is normal practice. This amount will continue to reduce as rate payments are received over the remainder of the year in line with the quarterly instalment and annual payment due dates.

3. Prepayments (\$1.3M) Decrease

Due to prepayments as at 30 June 2025 having now been reversed/received in the current financial year.

4. Non current assets held for sale

(\$2.3M) Decrease

Reduction due to the sale of property in the first quarter of the financial year.

5. Trade and Other Payables

(\$11.0M) Decrease

Mainly due to amounts that were outstanding to suppliers as at 30 June 2025 being paid/recognised in the current financial year.

6. Trust Funds and Deposits

\$3.0M Increase

Mainly relates to the collection of first quarterly instalments of the Fire Services Property Levy which will be passed onto the State Revenue Office in October.

7. Contract and Other Liabilities

(\$22.0M) Decrease

Mainly due to large capital grant amounts paid to Council in 2024/25 in advance of expenditure on these projects e.g. Regional Car Park Fund & Regional Sports Infrastructure programs.

STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS OVERVIEW

The budgeted cash & investments at the beginning of the year was \$100.5 million, the actual opening balance was \$139.3 million. The additional \$38.8 million was largely the result of higher than anticipated surplus funds as a result of advanced FAGS funding and capital grants. There has been a relatively low net cash outflow of \$1.5 million over the first quarter mainly as a result of the expenditure of funding received in the 2024/25 financial year.

STATEMENT OF CAPITAL WORKS OVERVIEW

As at the 30 September 2025 Council has spent \$11.1M on capital works mostly on Property (buildings) projects \$6.1M, Infrastructure projects \$4.0M (including Roads projects \$2.7M) and Plant & Equipment \$1.0M. Full year forecasted capital expenditure is \$102.5M compared to the budget of \$87.3M. The \$15.2M increase in expenditure is due to funds being carried forward from the previous financial year due to changes in the timing of receipt of grants funds and undertaking of works that was expected when the budget was compiled.

Note the total capital expenditure disclosed in the Statement of Capital Works varies from the Income Allocation Statement (IAS) Capital expenditure line item due to the IAS figure including projects that are capital in nature but do not meet Council's policy requirements for asset recognition/capitalisation together with the Landfill Construction/Rehabilitation line including some costs that are included in the Statement of Capital Works.

NOTES TO THE CAPITAL WORKS STATEMENT - Full Year Forecast Variances

1. Buildings

(\$6.1M) Increased Expenditure

Primarily due to expenditure that has carried forward from previous budget allocations and cash surpluses, including Regional Car Parks Fund Projects at Commercial Rd Morwell \$1.2M and Kay St Traralgon \$0.9M, Morwell Depot upgrade \$0.8M, Building Renewal Programs \$0.6M, Immigration Park Morwell public toilet \$0.6M, Northern Reserve Newborough pavilion \$0.5M, Solar Power generation installations \$0.4M, Leisure UV disinfectant units \$0.3M, GRAC lockers \$0.3M together with a number of smaller project amounts..

2. Plant, machinery & equipment

(\$1.2M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to items of fleet and large plant that were budgeted in the previous year but as a result of delays in delivery times were not able to be received until the 2025/26 financial year. Funds have been carried forward to pay for these items.

3. Computers & telecommunications

(\$0.2M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to government grant funded carry forward Public Wi-Fi improvements \$0.2M.

4. Roads

(\$1.5M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly relates to carry forward works for Road Rehabilitation program \$0.4M, Gordon/English Street DCP works \$0.3M, Landfill access road \$0.3M and Landslip restoration works \$0.3M.

5. Footpaths & cycleways

(\$0.1M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to funding carried forward from the 2024/25 financial year to complete Footpath Rehabilitation Program works.

6. Drainage

(\$1.5M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to timing of grants and carry forward funding for Piped system enhancements & stormwater quality improvement program \$0.4M, Stormwater outfall rehabilitation program \$0.3M Glengarry Flood Mitigation works \$0.2M and other carry forward works for drainage programs \$0.6M.

NOTES TO THE CAPITAL WORKS STATEMENT - Full Year Forecast Variances

7. Recreational, leisure & community facilities

(\$0.5M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to unbudgeted government grant funding and other funding carried forward from 2024/25 including the GRAC Geothermal Pump Replacement \$0.3M.

8 Waste management

(\$2.6M) Increased Expenditure

This mainly relates to works on the new landfill cell \$2.5M, together with the Leachate treatment plant \$0.1M with both projects funded from the landfill reserve.

9. Parks, open space and streetscapes

(\$1.3M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to unbudgeted government grant funded projects and funding carried forward from 2024/25 including Sports Lighting for Toners Lane Reserve \$0.4M, Tyers skate park/BMX pump track \$0.3M and the Mathison Park Play space upgrade \$0.2M.

10. Offstreet carparks

(\$0.1M) Increased Expenditure

Funding carried forward for sealing of unsealed off street carparks.

11. New asset expenditure

(\$3.8M) Increased Expenditure

Primarily due to expenditure that has carried forward from previous budget allocations and cash surpluses, including Regional Car Parks Fund Projects at Commercial Rd Morwell \$1.2M and Kay St Traralgon \$0.9M, Immigration Park Morwell public toilet \$0.6M, Northern Reserve Newborough pavilion \$0.5M, Solar Power generation installations \$0.4M.

12. Asset renewal expenditure

(\$7.9M) Increased Expenditure

Primarily due to funds carried forward from the 2024/25 financial year Highland Highway landfill cell construction \$2.5M, Fleet and large plant replacement programs \$1.0M, Building Renewal programs \$0.6M, Depot Morwell upgrade \$0.8M, Council Support Package funded projects (CSPF) \$0.6M, drainage renewal programs \$0.5M and other various carry forward projects.

13. Asset upgrade expenditure

(\$3.4M) Increased Expenditure

Mainly due to unexpended funds carried over from the 2024/25 financial year and unbudgeted government grants including Sports Lighting for Toners Lane Reserve \$0.4M, Geothermal pump replacement \$0.3M, Piped Systems Enhancement & Stormwater Quality Improvement \$0.4M, Council Support Package funded projects (CSPF) \$0.3M, Landslip Betterment Works \$0.3M, Gross Pollutant Trap \$0.2M, Glengarry Flood Mitigation construction \$0.2M together with a number of smaller carry forward project amounts.

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REVIEW OF COUNCIL DELEGATIONS

PURPOSE

To seek Council's approval of an updated *Instrument of Delegation to Members of Council Staff* ('S6 Delegation').

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- To allow for Council to operate effectively and best utilise available resources, Council is empowered under various legislation and regulations to delegate many of its powers, duties and functions to the Chief Executive Officer, Delegated Committees and other appropriate Council officers.
- The Instrument of Delegation to Members of Staff (S6) Attachment 1 has been reviewed by officers as part of regular reviews, with delegated positions and powers updated as appropriate.
- Key changes are updated:
 - employee occupation titles to reflect the recent organisational realignment;
 and
 - o the Cemeteries and Crematoria Regulations Act to the 2025 version.
- The S5 Instrument of Delegation to the Chief Executive Officer has been reviewed and does not require any changes at this time, having been updated along with the Procurement Policy at the Council Meeting held 24 February 2025.
- It is imperative from an accountability, transparency and risk management perspective that Instruments of Council Delegation are legislatively compliant and accurately maintained, which requires regular reviews and updates as relevant legislation changes or there are alterations to officer roles.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. in the exercise of the powers conferred by the legislation referred to in the S6 Instrument of Delegation to Members of Staff at Attachment 1, resolves that:
 - a) there be delegated to the members of Council staff holding, acting in or performing the duties of the offices or positions referred to in the attached S6 Instrument of Delegation to Members of Staff, the powers, duties and functions set out in that Instrument, subject to the conditions and limitations specified in that Instrument;
 - b) this Instrument comes into force immediately after the common seal of Council is affixed to the instrument;
 - on the coming into force of the Instrument all previous delegations to members of Council staff (other than the Chief Executive Officer) are revoked; and
 - d) the duties and functions set out in the Instrument must be performed, and the powers set out in the Instruments must be executed, in accordance with any guidelines or policies of Council that it may from time to time adopt.

BACKGROUND

In accordance with section 11 of the *Local Government Act 2020*, Council may delegate many of its powers, duties and functions to the Chief Executive Officer and Delegated Committees.

Other Acts and regulations allow specific powers, functions, and duties of Council under those Acts and regulations to be delegated to appropriate Council staff. Delegation of powers is generally considered essential to enable day-to-day decisions to be made.

The Instrument of Delegation to Members of Council Staff (S6) acts to delegate various Council powers, duties or functions lawfully permitted under relevant legislation or associated regulations to be delegated to and exercised by an appropriate Council officer.

ANALYSIS

Instrument of Delegation to Members of Council Staff (S6)

To ensure continued compliance with the relevant Acts and regulations as they change over time, Instruments of Delegation must be reviewed regularly, and amendments made where required.

By way of assistance with the review process, Maddocks Lawyers provide councils with a bi-annual update of legislative amendments and associated recommended changes to delegations. These changes and any updates are further reflected in the Delegation Management System (RelianSys) used by Council officers to manage delegations.

Effective and efficient functioning of local government would not be possible if the delegation of certain Council powers was not available. Delegations enable the performance of Council's required duties and functions, while ensuring effective oversight by Council.

Delegations facilitate the achievement of good governance for the community by empowering appropriate members of staff to make decisions on behalf of the Council. When delegations are utilised correctly, processing delays and unnecessary expenditure can be reduced, and resources are optimised.

Departments within Council have also provided operational information to assist the review process to ensure that the required positions have the correct delegations to perform their role. Position titles have also been updated to reflect the recent organisational realignment.

 - (b) strategy adopted by Council;
 - 2.3.3 if the determining of the issue, the taking of the action or the doing of the act or thing cannot be the subject of a lawful delegation; or
 - 2.3.4 the determining of the issue, the taking of the action or the doing of the act or thing is already the subject of an exclusive delegation to another member of Council staff or delegated committee.

PURPOSE

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Through Instruments of Appointment and Authorisation, Council appoints specific officers to be authorised officers for the administration and enforcement of legislation under applicable Acts.
- By authorising Rob Wilkie, the officer will be able to perform their duties with respect to the planning powers and functions of the Council.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council, in the exercise of the powers conferred by section 147(4) of the *Planning and Environment Act 1987*, resolves that:

- 1. Rob Wilkie be appointed and authorised as set out in the Instrument of Appointment and Authorisation attached to this report;
- 2. the Instrument of Appointment and Authorisation comes into force immediately after the common seal of Council is affixed to the instrument, and remains in force until Council determines to vary or revoke it; and
- 3. the Instrument of Appointment and Authorisation be sealed.

BACKGROUND

There are often clauses within Acts or Regulations that state an "authorised officer" can undertake a specific function and therefore the authorised officer needs to be identified by role and officer name.

Section 147(4) of the *Planning and Environment Act 1987* provides for the following:

Any reference in this Act to an Authorised officer of a responsible authority or of the Department is a reference to an officer or employee of the authority or employee of the Department whom the authority or the Secretary to the Department (as the case requires) authorises in writing generally or in a particular case to carry out the duty or function or to exercise the power in connection with which the expression is used.

Section 313 of the *Local Government Act 2020* provides for the following:

- (1) The Secretary, a Council or a person authorised by the Council either generally or in a particular case may institute proceedings in the corporate name of the Council for—
 - (a) the recovery of any municipal rates, service charges, special purpose charges, fees or other money due to the Council under any Act, regulation or local law; or
 - (b) the enforcement of any provision of any Act, regulation or local law for which the Council is responsible; or
 - (c) the recovery of any penalty or surcharge in relation to any offence under any Act, regulation or local law the enforcement of which is the responsibility of the Council; or
 - (d) any other purpose specified by the Council.
- (2) A Chief Executive Officer or person authorised by the Council either generally or in a particular case may represent the Council in all respects as though the Chief Executive Officer or person authorised by the Council was the party concerned in any proceedings in which the Council is a party or has an interest.
- (3) Proceedings for a summary offence under this Act may be commenced within the period of 3 years after the commission of the alleged offence.

ANALYSIS

Section 147(4) of the *Planning and Environment Act 1987* and section 313 of the *Local Government Act 2020* specifically require that the appointment of an authorised officer must come from Council.

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TOURISM & MAJOR EVENTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE UPDATES

PURPOSE

To present the recommendations from the Tourism and Major Events Advisory Committee and seek Council approval to fund the following three major events: 2026 Motorcycling Australia Pro MX; 2027 Football Victoria Country Championships; and the, 2027–2031 AGL Loy Yang Traralgon Junior International Tennis Championships.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- At its meeting held 1 October 2025, the Tourism and Major Events Advisory Committee (TAMEAC) recommended funding support for the 2026 Motorcycling Australia Pro MX and the 2027 Football Victoria Country Championships.
- As negotiations extended beyond the scheduled meeting timeframe, an out-ofsession email was distributed to TAMEAC on 14 October 2025 to obtain endorsement for the 2027–2031 AGL Loy Yang Traralgon Junior International Tennis Championships. TAMEAC considered the proposal and recommended funding be allocated to support the event.
- These three events can be funded from the Major Event Attraction budget and, as a result, there are no budget implications.
- The projected economic impact for the three events combined is in excess of \$6.5 million, with a return on investment per dollar spend of \$65:1. The economic impact breakdown for each event is listed in the background section of the report.
- Event and recreation teams will liaise with the relevant user groups to discuss
 the timing of the events once the event dates are confirmed. This collaboration
 will ensure minimal disruption to regular activities and ensure the smooth
 delivery of the events.
- These major events have been reviewed and considered by officers based on an assessment prepared outlining economic benefit, community engagement, return on investment and benefit to the local community. Details of the assessments are provided in **Attachment 1 – 3**.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

That Council adopts the recommendations of the Tourism and Major Events Advisory Committee and authorises officers to enter into a suitable agreement to fund the following events through the annual major events attraction budget:

- a. 2026 Motorcycling Australia Pro MX for \$25,000;
- b. 2027 Football Victoria Country Championships for \$30,000 and inkind venue hire and waste management; and
- c. 2027 2031 AGL Loy Yang Traralgon Junior International Tennis Championships for \$45,000 per year for 5 years (subject to CPI throughout the term of the deal).

BACKGROUND

2026 Motorcycling Australia Pro MX

The ProMX Championship is a premium level competition for the sport of Motocross in Australia and has a long-standing reputation as one of the leading domestic championships in the world. Known for attracting international riders and media coverage to a global audience, the series also acts as a successful development platform for young Australian talent to land in an international series with a strong contingent of Australian riders currently competing (and landing on the podium) in the MXGP and AMA Motocross series.

Having confirmed large broadcast deals for each round of the Series, the destination branding and regional exposure to be realised through hosting this event has exponentially increased in recent years and is set to further develop into the future. The event is expected to attract approximately 320 competitors and a further 3,000 spectators, generating strong visitation and economic benefits for the region.

2027 Football Victoria Country Championships

The Football Victoria Country Championships is a three-day tournament that brings together the best regional junior football talent from across Victoria, while also showcasing the host region, its community, and local businesses.

The 2027 Championships will be one of the first major events to use the newly completed Gippsland Sports and Entertainment Precinct (GSEP), shining a spotlight on the significant investment by Latrobe City Council and the State Government in the wake of the Commonwealth Games cancellation. The event is expected to attract approximately 1,350 competitors and a further 3,000 spectators, generating strong visitation and economic benefits for the region.

2027 – 2031 AGL Loy Yang Traralgon Junior International Tennis Championships

The event is a prestigious J300 tournament on the World Tennis Tour Junior circuit, attracting the best under-18 players from around the globe. Held annually in Traralgon, it serves as a key lead-in to the Australian Open Junior Championships each January, providing a high-performance platform for both international and Australian top junior players.

Hosted in Traralgon for the past 33 years, this world class international tennis tournament spans 14 days and features more than 150 players representing approximately 35 countries. The event not only showcases elite junior tennis talent but also reinforces Traralgon's reputation as a premier destination for international sporting events.

Subject to Council's approval of the event, it is anticipated that a media announcement will occur at the January 2026 event, informing community and stakeholders of the event's renewal for a further 5-years.

One of the key actions to build capacity is through the training and development of match officials. The Championships provide an excellent opportunity for referees and match officials to gain experience, mentorship, and further their qualifications under the guidance of FV's Referee Department and key mentors. As part of the event, workshops and mentor sessions are held for regional officials while they are congregated in a central location, ensuring that more referees develop to officiate at all levels of the sport and take these skills back to the home regions for ongoing participation.

As a crucial part of Football Victoria's talent development structure, the Championships feed directly into the National Training Centre (NTC) and Talent Identification & Development Centre (TIDC) programs. These programs are designed to identify and develop the next generation of elite players, with a direct pathway to the Emerging & Young Matildas teams for girls, and Joeys & Young Socceroos teams for boys.

At the Championships, talent scouts from FV and Football Australia's elite programs, including coverage from Victoria's three A League clubs, are on the lookout for promising players. Athletes identified during the event are offered the opportunity to trial and join these prestigious development programs, where they receive high-level coaching and exposure to national and potentially international competition.

This process broadens the scope of the football talent pool, ensuring that no player is overlooked due to geographical or social barriers.

In addition to players, coaches and officials, the event also relies heavily on volunteers to support the logistics and day-to-day operations. Volunteers are recruited from local clubs and communities, giving them the chance to develop event management, communication, and operational skills alongside FV staff. These volunteers gain valuable experience, making them more likely to take on leadership roles within their local football clubs or associations, further growing Football's capacity and overall sustainability in regional areas.

During the installation of 200 bored piers, a significant risk was identified that the holes could collapse prior to concrete being placed due to the soil conditions at a depth of 4.2 metres. To mitigate this risk, the piers will be drilled and filled progressively over a 5-day period, with inspections carried out daily. This approach avoids drilling all piers at once and reduces the potential for structural failure.
