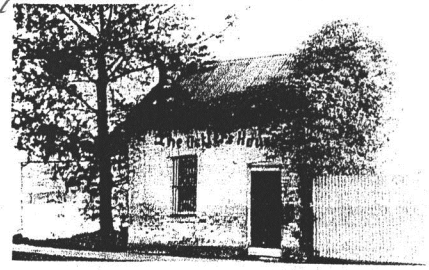

THE OSTLER'S HOUSE

In the beginning of the year 1858, the government in Melbourne sent a surveyor to Traralgon to mark out the township. This surveyor marked our first streets. All he saw was the track to Sale past the hotel, the rest all open grassy forest. He called this track Kay Street on both sides of the creek after Captain Kay who was a Government officer in Melbourne. He marked Franklin St. in the grass, naming it after Sir John Franklin who had been Governor of Van Diemen's Land. He also named Grey St, Seymour St and Hotham St. after Sir Charles Hotham who had been Governor of Victoria. The land was now for sale to settlers; the day of huge cattle runs was over.

Duncan Campbell had previously bought the Traralgon West run from James Purves in 1854. He built a homestead where the Traralgon Park homestead is now. Duncan decided to build a hotel in 1858, the Traveller's Rest. This part of Traralgon was on his run, so he picked a bit of high ground, before the track went down to the bridge over the creek. It was an ambitious building, there were four sitting rooms, a dining room, eight bedrooms, as well as the bar and cellar. Out in the yard were six more bedrooms, the kitchen and laundry. The building was of hand sawn logs, the cellar was built first, the first load of grog arrived and was drunk in the cellar before any of the rest of the hotel was built. Peter McColl a relative of Duncan's, was the licensee. Then in August 1859 the Government began selling land in Traralgon, Duncan bought all the land on the north side of Grey St. for £1 an acre. Ryan's Hotel corner was sold with the new Traveller's Rest on it. Anyone buying it also had to pay Duncan £1,725 for his hotel. A lot of money for those days! There were no takers, so Duncan bought the land for £4. He also bought extensive holdings in the rest of the 'town'.

The hotel did very well, gold was discovered in Gippsland and as Traralgon was on a direct route to the goldfields it soon began to grow. The road too was getting better. Coaches were running from Sale to Morwell with the mail. From there it was carried by packhorse as far as Nar Nar Goon where it was again carried by coach. Duncan Campbell was of course the Postmaster at Traralgon, his hotel was the Post Office, store, Court House, Church; the first wedding was conducted there in 1863, and meeting place, races, sports and cattle sales were held there. He was the "King of Traralgon" Then in 1865 Cobb & Co. coaches started running all the way to Melbourne. The horses were changed every 15 or 20 miles, and here at Traralgon the stables were at the renamed Traralgon Hotel, where the coach horses were kept. John Whalley was the ostler, Mr H. J. Mapelson recorded the ostler taking the coach horses to the swamps to wash the mud of travel from them. Horses were always indispensable even after the railway came to Traralgon. To post a letter from Walhalla took a forty mile ride to Traralgon. Horses were still being used as carriers up to the 1960's, ostlers were as essential as mechanics are now.

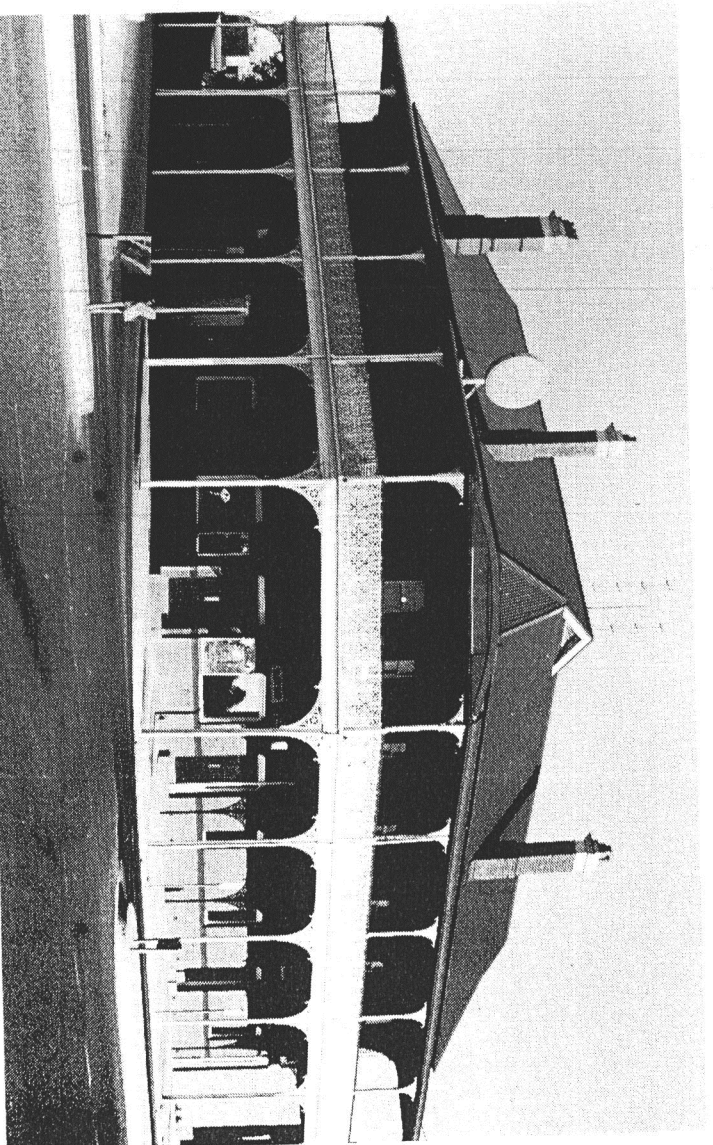
The hotel has changed hands several times, and has been renamed several times, but the 'reborn' hotel has stood on that spot, since before Traralgon was even a hamlet. It is 155 years old now, and a Google search failed to find another Ostler's House anywhere in Australia. We are probably the proud owners of the only one in OZ. As Mr Mapleson said "upon the struggles and toil of those adventurous pioneers are based the flourishing Traralgon of today."

This is our heritage, of inestimable value, it must be preserved.

Hotels played a very important part in our early history, usually being the only places offering accommodation and meals for travellers. The first of these were slab-built with bark roofs and little comfort. When Duncan Campbell, in 1858, built The Travellers' Rest (later the Taralgon Hotel) of pit-sawn red-gum timber, it immediately became a popular stopping place. It contained 8 bedrooms, 4 sitting rooms, a large dining room, bar and cellar in the main building. At the back a kitchen, laundry and 6 more bedrooms were built. Later, a store was added and another room which was used for public meetings, church services and a Court Room.



The present-day Taralgon Hotel, classified by the National Trust, was built in 1914 on the same site at the corner of Kay and Franklin

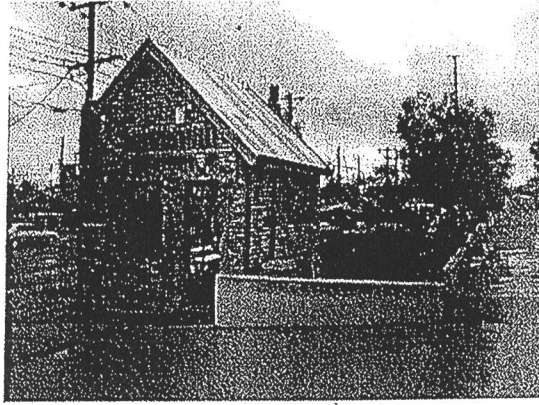


Figure 1 Albert Street Brunswick - now used as a cafe after restoration
